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

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PREFACE.

FULL half-century has passed away since the work of compiling a genealogy of the Goodrich family was systematically begun. It was first undertaken by Benjamin Douglass Goodrich (No. 687), and carried on until placed in the hands of his son, Rev. Hiram Plummer Goodrich, D.D. (No. 1497), a distinguished Presbyterian minister of St. Louis, Mo., a man of great force of character and especially fitted for the work. He devoted years of patient labor, and was at great expense in the search for information. He crossed the ocean twice in the prosecution of the work, visited Goodrich Castle, searched records abroad and at home, and made a very extensive and, it is supposed, a very complete collection of material for the book, bringing the work down to 1861, when he died. During these years of research he was ably assisted by Hon. Aaron Goodrich of St. Paul, Minn., president of the Goodrich Family Association, and who has recently died, and who also visited Goodrich Castle and brought away the views that adorn this memorial, presenting them to the Association.

After the death of Rev. Hiram P. Goodrich, his large collection of material was brought to Chicago, and during the war of the Rebellion was carefully packed, labeled, and deposited in the library of the Chicago Historical Society for safe keeping. Here it was destroyed in the great fire of 1871. Fortunately, Edwin Hubbard, then residing at Oak Park, Ill., had copied a portion of it, and at the instance of Harry C. Goodrich of Chicago and Hon. Leven S. Goodrich of Warner, Tenn., began the work anew, and parts One and Two of "The Goodrich

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Family Memorial" were issued, embracing a portion of the first five generations. The work was again suspended in the fall of 1883, and nothing further was done for two years, when Messrs. H. C. and L. S. Goodrich again renewed the effort to complete it. Through their influence the Goodrich Family Association was organized, with Hon. Aaron Goodrich of St. Paul, Minn., as president; Hon. Enos Goodrich of Fostoria, Mich., vice-president; H. C. Goodrich of Chicago, secretary and treasurer; Judge Grant Goodrich of Chicago, Leven S. Goodrich of Warner, Tenn., and Horace A. Goodrich of Chicago, executive committee; under whose supervision the work has been prosecuted and published.

The committee employed John F. Severance of Chicago to collect the materials for the book, and he spent nearly two years in correspondence with the widely-scattered branches of the Goodrich family and arranging the material collected for publication. Circumstances compelled the committee to place the manuscript in the hands of Dr. Lafayette W. Case of Chicago, for final revision, rearrangement, and completion, and the work has passed through the press under his editorial supervision.

In preparing this volume, a correspondence has been carried on extending to every part of the United States, and requiring nearly a thousand letters. An earnest effort has been made to make the work as accurate as possible, and in addition to the many private records furnished, many town, church, probate, and other public records have been consulted, as well as gravestones in ancient cemeteries. Undoubtedly errors will be found, arising partly from incorrect information furnished by persons relying too much upon memory, and partly from doubtful chirography. The spelling of proper names as given by the persons sending the information has been adopted, which will account for the variations in common names. Residence is always given when known, and if the place of death is known that is given the preference.

PREFACE.

In the preparation of this book the committee have had the valuable assistance of Henry H. Goodrich (No. 1485) of Philadelphia, who has made extensive researches relating to the origin of the name and the early history of the family in England; also of Henry Kent Goodrich (No. 2338) of Maywood, Ill., who has done a good deal of work in the same field. The essential parts of their work are contained in the Historical Introduction, which has been arranged and embodied, with his own researches, by Hon, Grant Goodrich, who has also met and assumed all the financial responsibilities of the Association, beyond the small amount received from subscriptions, and the cost of the views of Goodrich Castle and Court, which were contributed by the late Judge Aaron Goodrich of St. Paul. Thanks are also due to E. Byron Goodrich, Syracuse, N.Y.; Samuel Goodrich, Massena, N.Y.; Charles J. Goodrich, Columbia Springs, N.Y.; Elmer S. Goodrich, Stephenton, N.Y.; Fred. B. Goodrich, Delavan, Wis.; John K. Goodrich, Waterbury, Conn.; and many others, who are gratefully remembered.

After a considerable portion of the work was in print, the committee decided to make one more effort to trace out the English ancestors of the American emigrants, and an eminent English antiquary was employed to follow out a clue which promised to furnish some evidence on this point. This necessitated a good deal of delay and greatly-increased expense, but as the result was successful as regards the ancestry of John and William of Wethersfield, as is shown in the Historical Introduction, the committee feel amply repaid. For want of space, no attempt has been made to follow out the female lines, only those bearing the name Goodrich.

The Goodrich family is arranged in generations and the individuals are numbered consecutively on the left margin of the page. When the individual has children, and in a few other cases, his number is preceded by the mark +, and the reader vi

will look forward to the next generation, where the same number will be found in the middle of the page inclosed in parenthesis. Following the name of the head of a family will be found the names of all his ancestors, the small figure to the right indicating the generation. The number as used here will enable the reader, by referring forward or backward, to find the descendants or ancestors of any member of the family.

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A VISIT TO GOODRICH CASTLE.

Hon. GRANT GOODRICH, L. S. GOODRICH, HORACE A. GOODRICH, Executive Committee, Chicago, Ill.:

Gentlemen:—You desire that an account of my visit to Goodrich Castle and Goodrich Court may appear with a record of the family, which was commenced many years since and is now about to be completed by you and under your patronage and direction.

I am not unmindful of the labor incident to the collection of the valuable contribution to our family record, prepared in part by the late Hiram P. Goodrich of St. Louis, Mo., yet it should tell of the origin, names, achievements, and sufferings of a line reaching beyond the field of Hastings. If such a record be now possible, it can only be produced by the employment of much labor, skill, and research. As no man knows the grave of Harold, "the last of the Saxon kings," who fell fighting for the altars and fires of Britain, who shall say where the uncrowned sons of Godwin sleep, or determine the amount of blood and treasure contributed by the House or Castle of Goodrich? They too were Saxon-loyal to Harold and his cause. William would blot from the memory of the land the names of its bravest defenders, placing in their stead those who furthered his designs; of these the historian was permitted to write; thus we learn that Elizabeth, daughter and heiress of Gilbert, Earl of Shrewsbury, married Henry Grey, eighth Earl of Kent; and in 1706, Henry Grey, twelfth Earl of Kent, was created Viscount Goodrich of Goodrich Castle, and in 1710, Duke of Kent. His descendant, the Right-Hon. Frederick John Robinson,

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was created Viscount Goodrich, April 25, 1827. Thus does an ancient Saxon fortress and manor confer dignity upon the descendants of the victorious Norman. Verily,

> "The Norman came with iron hand, And from our fathers reft the land."

GOODRICH CASTLE AND GOODRICH COURT.

These structures should not be confounded.

Having resolved upon a pilgrimage to Goodrich, I left Belgium's capital in December, 1862; journeying by the way of Malines, Ghent, Lille, Calais, Dover, Canterbury, Chatham, London, and Ross.

When I beheld the far-off mountains of Wales, I remembered that their peaks were symbolized in the topniost jewel of the crown of Great Britain. That the Prince of Wales has been and is heir to the throne. That wherever he may first see the light of heaven-in legal contemplation that spot is Wales. Then I thought of the mountains I had seen in other parts of the world and of the influence they have exerted upon our race. That, while the story of William Tell is a myth, its success was due to the mountains in which the *venue* was laid. It was from a mountain that man received his most valuable statute. T love the mountains. They are beautiful to look upon, protect life, promote peace, and contribute to health of body and mind. As I contemplated those within the scope of my vision, I remembered the "Thanks be to God for Mountains," of William Howitt:

"Thanks be to God for Mountains! is often the exclamation of my heart as I trace the history of the world. From age to age they have been the last friends of man. In a thousand extremities they have saved him. What great hearts have throbbed in their defiles, from the days of Leonidas to those of Andrea Hoffer? What lofty souls, what tender hearts, what poor and persecuted creatures have they sheltered in their stony bosons, from the weapons and tortures of their fellow men?"

A VISIT TO GOODRICH CASTLE.

Descending the river from Ross, the mountains apparently recede, thus terminating in the everlasting hills which look down upon Goodrich. These seem joyously to "clap their hands," whether in contemplation of the silver border at their feet, popularly known as "the lovely Wye," whose crystal waters are wildly rushing on to the ocean, or the glorious landscape beyond—stretching out from the ancient Hundred of Goodrich, far away over orchard and meadow, field, hamlet, and spire, until the horizon shuts down upon the forest of Dean, none but the contemplative student of nature may presume to determine. The flowers of spring are gone, the Roman camp is not on the cliff, nor do the cannon of the republic thunder around the castle's keep.

The season here was that of the "sere and yellow leaf." Nature seemed to invite repose and encourage thought. Each surrounding object seemed pregnant with its story of the past:

> "If there be tongues in trees, What tales these giant oaks could tell; Tales of the peasant and the peer, Tales of the bridal and the bier, The welcome and farewell, For on their boughs the startled bird First in her midnight slumber heard The Norman's *curfew* bell."

The scepter has departed from the hand of the Saxon. Then I thought of scenes and a time still more remote. I remembered the story of the leader, general, legislator, and judge, who, though an hundred and twenty years old, yet his eyes were not dim nor his natural force abated. In obedience to the command of his great master, this sturdy leader, meek and faithful servant, ascends the rocky height of Mount Nebo; struggling on post, crag, and cliff, he reaches the uppermost and outermost peak, commanding the fords of the Jordan and the plains beyond. From this

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"He views the Canaan that he loved, With unbeclouded eyes."

The scene was varied and beautiful. He then beheld a portion of the inheritance which Jehovah had promised his people:


> "Sweet fields beyond the swelling flood Stand dressed in living green."

Soon this bright panorama fades out forever from his vision, since which mortal eye hath not beheld him. Then —there, between earth and heaven, alone with his God, this devoted life went out. Nor does the annals of our race record one other death so sublime. Reverting to my immediate surroundings, I then thought and now believe that Moses from Pisgah's top looked not down upon a scene more fair. Here, too,

> "The river nobly foams and flows, The charm of this enchanted ground, And all its thousand turns disclose Some fresher beauty varying round; The haughtiest breast its wish might bound Through life to dwell delighted here; Nor could a spot on earth be found To nature or to me more dear."

Goodrich is situated in Herefordshire, four miles southwest from Ross—"Here dwelt ye man of Ross," and six miles northeast from Monmouth. Here was born "Harry of Monmouth."

Both castle and court stand on the right bank of the Wye, in one of the beautiful curves for which this stream is so justly celebrated. The distance from Goodrich Ferry to Huntsham Ferry is, by the river, eight miles—by land it is but one. An ancient stone cross, evidently of Roman construction, a church, with a history, and a cemetery containing sepulchral monuments, from the shields of which time has long since blotted the names they were raised to

commemorate, will arrest the attention and reward the research of the curious visitor.

Near Peneraig House you obtain a combined view of Goodrich Court and Goodrich Castle. The former is a palace or residence with halls, galleries, and appendages. modern in point of years, yet of baronial or castellated type. It stands upon commanding and finely-chosen grounds near the Wye. It was the seat of the late Sir Samuel Rush Meyrick, LL.D., by whom it was built with seeming disregard of cost, and was evidently intended, by its towers, moats, drawbridges, etc., to perpetuate the prominent features of the castle. It was enriched and adorned by a collection of ancient arms and armor—the most costly. curious, and instructive ever gathered and possessed by one man. This collection involved the labor of a life, coupled with the expenditure of much treasure. These precious gatherings were placed within walls which seem to mock the ravages of time, and were admirably arranged by Sir Samuel. (He arranged the ancient arms in the Tower of London at the instance of the government.)*

The preservation of this collection is made, as I believe, a perpetual trust. The antiquarian will learn with regret that the collection has, since the death of Dr. Meyrick, been removed to the Kensington Museum. The plea for this transfer was that of equal safety coupled with more ready access by the denizens of the great metropolis. Thus does this noble benefactor rest from his labors with a reasonable prospect that his works may follow him. Should the spoiler come, these gems may yet live in the admirable descriptions of Dr. Meyrick and the faithfullyengraved illustrations by Joseph Skelton, F. S. A.

A history of Goodrich Castle, were it now possible to

Born, 1783; died, 1848. write it, would require more space than the present work can afford, yet it is certainly deserving of more than can now be said by the best informed writer.

Time and the vandal have done their work. The name of this castle, like a portion of its walls, is "the most truly Saxon that can be,"*—hence older—evidently much older than the conquest. Its location and manner of construction tell of high antiquity, yet, like its younger neighbors, it has been subject to reconstruction and change—while evidences of its early origin remain.

Man, whether civilized or barbaric, has ever been aggressive; this character is well defined in the lines:

> "For they will take who have the power, And they will keep, who can."

Hence the necessity for the early construction of this fortress, that settlers in the vicinity might be protected from murdering bands—"free-booters" of the Robin Hood class, then infesting the land.

The Roman builded with reference to strength and durability, yet man and the elements have nearly obliterated the result of his labors during the many years of his domination in Britain.

Goodrich Castle is one of the most picturesque and attractive of the ancient remains which abound in this part of the island:

* Names are often significant, sometimes derived from the trade or vocation of an ancestor. That of Goodrich was not so derived. In the post-office directory for the city of London (this is an official record) these distinctions are strictly observed. The list headed "Court Directory," for 1863 (the only edition I possess), occupies 157 pages; that of commercial and professional names, 658 pages. To names in the former list "Esquire" should be added, if the party be not of higher dignity. This court directory contains the names of seven members of the Goodrich family, while the commercial and professional directory—extended as it is—contains but three. These latter were merchants, and, so far as I could learn when in London, men who, if residents of the United States, might have been respected members of a board of trade, chamber of commerce, or of a legislative body. This subject is there treated as one of caste, and is, in part, regulated by statute.

A VISIT TO GOODRICH CASTLE.

"A gentle hill its side inclines, Lovely in England's fadeless green, To meet the rapid stream which winds Through this romantic scene."

This castle "is the relic of a noble fortalice, and would seem (seated on the topmost height of a hill that overlooks the rapid river, and aided by its broad moat which time has not yet filled up) to have been impregnable; it was not so. Whatever its ancient glory may have been, it was doomed to fall before the persevering energy of the troops of the Commonwealth, and 'the eighty barrels of powder' which 'the Commons voted' as auxilaries to their officer, Col. Birch. He found the work, however, notwithstanding the added succors of 'battering cannontwo monster pieces,' and 'six grenadoes,' by no means easy, for the garrison, under brave Sir Richard Lingen, kept him 'without' from the 22d of June to the 3d of August, 1646, which so exasperated the assailants that they refused to recognize a 'white flag for parley,' insisted upon 'unconditional surrender,' and made prisoners of war the governor and all his troops, with their arms, amnunition, and provisions."

After a thorough inspection of the fortress,

"From donjon keep to turret wall,"

• I turned from its half-shaded and ivy-covered ruin, with its story of a thousand years, and looked again on Goodrich Court, which, in all its grandeur and perfection, yet seemed to say:

> "There is a power And magic in the ruined battlement, To which the palace of the present hour Must yield its pomp, and wait till ages are its dower."

As the time for my departure drew near, my desire to remain increased. Remembering that these walls and ramparts, now so desolate and fallen, had looked down upon scenes of peace and war, martial pomp, the clangor of arms—the trumpet's blast—the silken folds of gorgeous banners proudly flung to the breeze in sunshine and storm. Enemies repelled—friends and the stranger greeted with generous hospitality within walls which "laughed a siege to scorn." Then,

> "Day set on Goodrich's castled steep, And Wye's fair river, broad and deep, And Cambria's mountains lone, The battle towers, the donjon keep, The loop-hole grates where captives weep, The flanking walls that round it sweep, In yellow lustre shone.

"The warriors on the turrets high, Moving athwart the evening sky, Seemed forms of giant height. Their armour, as it caught the rays, Flashed back again the western blaze In lines of dazzling light." *

Now all is changed. Recrossing the grounds, I approached a commanding position and took a last lingering look at the field. No strife was seen, no assault upon the fortress, no warrior frowned from its ruined battlements. Yet I remembered that in the olden time:

"Here, above all, was a castle vigorously besieged; every spot in and about was the scene of a conflict, a flight, a pursuit; that where the slaughtered fell, there were they buried.—What is not burial ground in war?"

There was no human being visible, yet I said *furcwell*; stepped lightly upon the sod which, perchance, covers all that remains of some brave man who went down beneath the shock of battle. A moment later I stood upon the king's highway, which led me back to Ross.

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THE GOODRICH FAMILY.

HISTORICAL INTRODUCTION.

By Hon. GRANT GOODRICH of Chicago.

G OODRICH, like most other family names, has been subject to a variety of changes and modifications, all of them, however, retaining in part at least their original Teutonic and Saxon signification. We know that names were originally derived from residence, occupation, personal appearance, or as expressive of some mental, moral, or other distinguishing personal characteristic, as Rossman, Hillman, etc., Tailor, Smith, etc., Brown, Black, etc., Gay, Wise, etc.; and by the use of a prefix or suffix, original names were modified and extended to various persons of the same patronymic, as Goldsmith, Blacksmith, etc. Like diversity has also occurred in attempts to conform them to a different language.


It is certain that Goodrich was originally Godric, from which came Godricus, Godryke, Goodryke, Guthrich, Guthridge, Gothridge, Godridge, Goodridge, etc. In the correspondence between Col. Brich, commander of the parliamentary forces in the siege of Goodrich Castle, and Sir Henry Lingen, who defended it, the latter called it Guthridge Castle, while Birch called it Goodrich Castle. Some of these diversities were doubtless occasioned by attempts to Latinize or Anglicize the original Teutonic name, or grew out of provincial pronunciation; but in whatever form it is found, the radical word is always preserved. The Saxon word *god* is clearly the primary root of the name, and has the same meaning as the Gothic word *guth* and the Danish *gud*, the *u* having the sound of *oo*. In Anglo-Saxon, the words *god* and *good* are written

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exactly the same; and as the word good was used not only to signify Deity, but rule or ruler, it probably had the latter meaning when applied to persons; and though the names were spelled Godric, Goodrich, Guthrich, Goodridge, or otherwise, if the primary word god, good, or guth were retained the meaning was the same. Whether the suffix ric, rick, or rich really meant rich, or had the same meaning as when added to Bishop, as Bishopric, signifying dominion or rule over a district is not entirely certain.

Robert Ferguson, M.P., in "Surnames as a Science," p. 53, says: "Godricus Doomsday (book), English Godrickrick, ric, is rich in old Saxon." In the "Etymological Dictionary of Family and Christian Names," by William Arthur, M.A., it is said: "Goodrich (Saxon), Godrick from god or good; ric, rich—is rich in God or in goodness." In "Our English Surnames, their Sources and Signification," by Chas. Warring Bardaley, p. 20, we are told that "The primary root god or good, which stood in all Teutonic languages as the title of divinity, was familiarized as the chief component in several names, such as Godebold, now Godbold, etc. * * Goodrich or Godrick are appellations which belonged to an early Saxon abbot, who was exalted to the ranks of the saints, as St. Godric, is also found in our existing registers." Whether the name was originally intended to indicate one rich in God or in goodness, a good ruler, or a ruler over a good district or domain, is not important at this day; either denotes an honorable family origin and name, which all who inherit should strive never to dishonor or disparage.

The Goodrich tribe or family evidently existed in Great Britain at a very early period, but when or at what place it first appeared is lost in the obscurity of the past. So far as we have been able to learn, the earliest mention of the name is referred to in Edwin Hubbard's "Goodrich Family Memorial," where it is said: "The following is found in Ingulph's 'History of the Abbey of Croyland,' and whatever may be thought of the value of that work



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as to charters recited and historical events recounted, its history of its own abbots is doubtless correct. After the destruction of the abbey by the Danes under Harold and Sidroc, in the year 870, in the times of Ethelred and Alfred, Ingulph says: 'By common consent of all, the venerable Father Godric, though very reluctant and making great opposition thereto, was elected abbot.' The abbot for the next four years was harassed by fines and confiscations by the king of Mercia till that kingdom ended, and Alfred reigned over both that and Wessex. In the reign of Edmund, A.D. 940, weighed down with extreme old age, Godric, abbot of Croyland, died."

An early mention of the name Godrick is found in "The Buik of Chronicles of Scotland, or a Metrical Version of the History of Hector Brece, by Wm. Stewart." At page 694, the poet says, in substance, Donald directed a messenger to be sent to England to Edgar, son of Queen Margaret and King Malcom, to come to Scotland and be crowned; and in the quaint language of that day, at page 696:

"Edgar the prince to Scone, than haif tha brocht, In robe royal that worthilie was wrocht, And crown of gold, with sword, cepter, and ring, Into Scotland was first anointed king Be ane Godrick, as that my author sais, Of Saint Andrias was Bishop in that dais."

It is probable one of the earliest evidences of their existence is found in the ruins of Goodrich Castle, descriptions of which are given by several English writers, with plates showing their present condition. We condense the descriptions given:

Goodrich Castle stands on a commanding eminence, near the southeastern extremity of the County of Herford, in Herfordshire, Wales, on the eastern bank of the River Wye; distant, almost due south, from Herford sixteen miles, and four from Ross. The land immediately

surrounding the castle and belonging to it is wholly in the County of Herford. The keep, which stands in the southwest corner of the ruins, must have been first built. probably many years, it may be a century or more, before the subsequent and larger part was erected. This keep was built for defence, and probably as a protection to the surrounding country. It was of solid masonry, twentynine feet square, with walls over seven feet thick; having three rooms, one above the other, fourteen and a half feet square, with a dungeon beneath, which had no connexion with the rooms above. This dungeon had not a single loop-hole for light or air, only by a narrow passage that led to it from another smaller, yet very strong dungeon under the platform of the steps leading to the entrance to the keep. This keep clearly antedates the Norman conquest, and is as truly Saxon as it can be, while its surrounding works are mainly Norman. The windows are in every respect Saxon. The one in the middle of the upper story remains as it was built, and the manner in which the large side columns stand, somewhat within the arch, is in keeping with the style adopted by the Saxons, and continued to the time of Edward the Confessor, about the year 1050; also the ornament between these columns is that in use by the earliest Saxons. The window below this is similar in general construction, but the columns which support it are smaller and higher, with similar mouldings. The middle part of the window has been altered, by inserting a stone frame for glass of the style and age of Henry VI, and probably in the time of Earl Talbot-tradition says for his own use. "Monumenta Antiqua," Vol. III, p. 250. In the same apartment there was a fire hearth, and from this room a circular staircase made in the wall, which led to the upper story, the door to which had a single transom stone of Saxon architecture. The principal entrance to the keep was by a flight of heavy stone steps, distinct from the building, ascending to a platform before the doorway leading to

the second chamber. The entrance to the dungeon was under an opening with flat sides, and seems to have been inserted long after the keep was built. Everything about this entrance, its plans, and arrangements show the high antiquity of the castle.

In "Monumenta Antiqua," Grosse's "Antiquities," and several other works, minute descriptions are found, showing the castle as enlarged, its ultimate size, arrangement, and great strength, and the probable different periods in which it was enlarged, as indicated by the various styles of architecture used in its construction. They concede there is no certain evidence when these enlargements were made, but suppose they occurred between the tenth century and about 1350. The keep was manifestly built for military purposes, and the additions to fit it for baronial residence. The length of the castle on the longest side, including projections of the towers, is about one hundred and seventy-six feet. It had two massive towers, and its ruins indicate its strength and prominence.

We do not propose to give a description here of its great halls, of its spacious chambers, chapel, and stately towers, there being no evidence that the Goodriches ever possessed any part of it, but the keep. This and the manor lands need not necessarily have passed out of the family by forfeiture to the king, as lands in England previous to the Norman conquest were held by the custom of gavel-kind, and lands held by this tenure descended to the children equally, and may have been sold and the price divided, instead of the lands; or they may have vested wholly in female children. However it may have occurred, it seems probable it took place previous to the Norman conquest, 1066, as no mention is made of its gift by William to any of his followers in Doomsday (book), 1086, or its then ownership by any of the name, though reference is made to the lands of a great number bearing the name.

All the other historical evidence we have been able to

find, in relation to the probable founder of the castle and its subsequent ownership, is embraced in the following extract from "The Beauties of England and Wales," in twenty-six volumes, published in 1805. In Vol. 6, pp. 516 to 526, after a minute description of the castle, it is said: "Whoever was the original founder of the castle, whether Godricus Dux, who witnessed King Canute's charters (A.D. 1016 to 1036), or any chieftain prior to him, it is certain the earliest authentic record concerning it, at present known, is of the date of 1204, when it was given by King John to William Strigul, Earl Marshall, to hold by service of two knights' fees. His son Walter, Earl of Pembroke, died here in the year 1246. It was afterward conveyed by a female to William de Valence, Earl of Pembroke, whose third son, Aymer de Valence, became his heir, and was murdered in France, 1323, From him it passed to the Talbots, by the marriage of Elizabeth Comyn, daughter of John, with Sir Richard, afterward Lord Talbot, who procured a license from Edward III, to have prision here. This Richard was a renowned soldier and statesman, and is thought to have expended a considerable part of the ransoms obtained from prisoners, taken by him in the French wars, on the reparation and improvement of Goodrich Castle. His descendant, John Talbot, the great Earl of Shrewsbury, who was killed at the battle of Castillon, in 1453, * * is styled Lord of Goodrich Castle and Orchenfield. His descendants were equally distinguished for brayery, and were frequently employed in affairs of great trust. George, the sixth earl, had the custody of Mary, Oueen of Scots, committed to * * Gilbert, seventh earl of Shrewsbury, his charge. was in possession of this castle at his death, on 14 of James 1st. Elizabeth, his second daughter and coheiress, conveyed it with the manor, in marriage, to Henry de Grav, Earl of Kent, in whose family they continued until the year 1740, when, on the death of Henry, Duke of Kent, they were sold to Admiral Griffin, whose son, Geo. Griffin, Esq., is now (1805) the owner." It subsequently passed into the hands of Sir Samuel Meyrick, who built Goodrich Court, not far from the castle, the first stone of which was laid April 23, 1828.

The Talbots were in England before the Norman conquest, but were probably of French origin, and friendly to William, and held their possessions after the conquest.

On the breaking out of the civil war in 1642, between Charles I and the Parliament, a great effort was made by both parties to obtain possession of Goodrich Castle. Tt was first seized by Parliament, and occupied; but its forces were soon dislodged by the Royalists, and it was . held by them under command of Sir Henry Lingen. It was afterward besieged by the Parliamentary forces under Col. John Birch, and after a stubborn resistence of nearly two months and the gallant repulse of several assaults, it was surrendered to him, who recommended that it be demolished. Parliament ordered that the Countess of Kent be notified of this necessity, and satisfaction be made her; and on the first of March, 1647, resolved that "Goodrich Castle be totally disgarrisoned and slighted." The order was executed, and the castle left in ruins as they appear today, unchanged except by time and decay. Any one curious to learn further details of the siege or description of the castle, may consult "Memoirs of Civil War," by Cary, 2 vols., "Grose's Antiquities," and "Monumenta Antiqua," Vol. 26, p. 516.

It is shown by Doomsday (book) and Freeman's "History of the Norman Conquest, 1066," that the land-holders of the Goodrich family were then numerous. Freeman makes repeated mention of a Godric of great prominence, who fell at Senlac in the battle of Hastings, bravely fighting for his king and country. He was officially conspicuous, and possessed of large landed estates in different counties. He was sheriff of Berkshire and Buckinghamshire, and possibly of Bedfordshire. At that time the sheriff was the first man in the county, and superior to any nobleman while he held his office. Freeman says, in Vol. IV, p. 22: "His name is so common that it is not always easy to distinguish his lands from the lands of the less distinguished Godrics; but it is plain his estates were large, both in his own shire and beyond its limits."

Also in Note B, p. 494, he says: "It is plain that he was, both by office and by extent of property, one of the first men of Berkshire, but it also strikes me that there are other reasons for the prominence given him in the Survey. His memory seems to be dealt with in somewhat the same way as the memory of Harold. The entries seem to reveal a certain anxiety to represent him as a wrong doer."

His lands were confiscated by William, and granted to Henry of Ferrers, whose descendants held the earldoms of Derby and Nottingham. To Godric's widow was granted a hide of land, to be held by the degrading tenure of feeding the king's dogs; and of this she was in the end defrauded. There are few men of that period, not of exalted rank, of whom this historian has made more frequent mention. In his list of the names of those patriotic Englishmen who came at the call of Harold to repel the invader, and who offered up their lives at Hastings, he says: "Still there are a few names which have come down to us, names to be cherished wherever the tongue of England is spoken, names which should sound like the call of the trumpet to the ears of every man of English birth." After naming a number of others, he proceeds: "Hither came Godric the sheriff, Lord of Fifhide," Vol. III, pp. 284-5; see also appendix, note E E, same vol.; also note B, Vol. IV, p. 494-6. In these references mention is made of the history of Abingdon, of which Godric's brother was bishop.

Their Saxon descent renders it probable the Goodriches were loyal to England and followed Harold, and, in consequence, their lands were forfeited to the conqueror and confiscated. In proof of the forfeiture of

their lands and offices, James F. Morgan, in his "England under the Norman Conquest," in a table of sheriffs or vice-comes, p. 200, says: "Berkshire, there was Godric, succeeded by Froyer, and second by Henry de Ferrers; Buckinghamshire, Godric, second by Anseulf, third William Fitz (son of) Anseulf; Cambridge, Alric Goodricson; in Tempus Rex Edwardus by Picot, in Tempus Rex William:" all displaced by Frenchmen, in accordance with the general government of the country by William. so that at the end of twenty years, and at the time of the return of the Doomsday Survey, there was scarcely a Saxon remaining in office in either the civil, church, or military service. This has been suggested as the reason why so many of the name became priests and ministers by profession. Hubbard gives from the Rotule, Henry VIII, of 1509 to 1546, the names of:

Thomas Goodricke, rector of Hogely, Lincoln. Sir John Goodryke, knight, Huntingdon. Thomas Goodryke, parish of Bowdon, Maj. Annie Goodrycke, prioress of Greenfield, Lincoln. Dr. Henry Goodrich, rector of Northfield, Kent. John Goodereych, preb. of Hudson, Stafford. John Goodridge, vicar of Clewdon, Somerset. Wm. Goodrich, rector of St. Martin, Outerfield, London. Rich'd Goodrich, comm. of poor, Parish of St. Nicholas, Gloucester.

There is a cannon on the esplanade of the Tower of London, with an inscription stating that it was presented by Sir Maurice Goodrich to (as now recollected) King Charles I. The copy of it was burned in the Chicago fire, October, 1871, and the authorities of the castle refused permission to visit the place when solicited during the last year.

Mention is frequently made of Goodriches in the public records of England, a few of which are here given:

Patent Roll.-4, Edward I, 1276-7. Appointment of

Roger Lonsday and John de Metingham to take the assize of *novel dissiesin*, arraigned by Roesia, late wife of John Blodles, against John Godriche, touching a tenement in Grantesete (now Grantchester) and Newenham (now Newnham), in the County of Cambridge.—M. 27 (86).

French Rolls.—14, Henry VI, membrane 17, at Westminster, Feb. (1435–6). Protection to (*inter alia*) Thomas Tukby, *alias* Goderich of Coventry, in the retinue of the Earl of Montaigue.

French Rolls.—29, Henry VI, mem. 16, at Westminster, Nov. 6 (1450–1). Protection to Thomas Goderyche of London, in the retinue of Ralph, Lord de Sudeley, Lieut. of Calais.

Bill of Court of Wards.—20 Oct., 9, Charles I, 1633. License of entry on lands to Sir John Jackson, Lady Jane Goodrich, his wife, and Sir Henry Goodrich, as coheirs of Sir Henry Smith, Bart. of Methley, in the County of York. The letters patent in the matter bear date 12 November following.

Warrant of Court of Wards.—10 Feb., 9, Charles I, 1634. Ouster-le-main to John Goodricke, son of Leon, of the third part of the manor of Stickney, in the County of Lincoln. The letters patent were not issued until May 20, 1637.

Judging from the names of the family and the amount of land held by each, found in two large quarto volumes, entitled, "Return made of Owners of Land in England and Wales," made by act of Parliament in 1873, and printed in London in 1875, it would seem the name is still common there, and borne by persons of substantial prosperity, for it appears that out of thirty-eight of the name in its different forms, found in these volumes, each is possessed of a fraction of over eighty-three acres. Doubtless there is a large number not so fortunate, and others whose property is personal.

During the reigns of Henry VIII and Edward VI, the most prominent of the name seems to have been Thomas Goodrich, bishop of Ely and lord chancellor of England. In 1510, he became fellow of Jesus College; 1515, proctor of the University; 1529, syndicus to return answer from the University of Cambridge, concerning the lawfulness of the marriage of Henry VIII with Oueen Catherine, and on that occasion recommended himself to royal favor. He was presented to the rectory of St. Peters, Cheapside, London, by Cardinal Wolsey; made canon of St. Stephen's, Westminster, and chaplain to the king; 1534, bishop of Elv. He was a zealous promoter of the Reformation; 1540, was appointed one of the revisers of the New Testament, the gospel of St. John being assigned to him. He was named commissioner for reforming the ecclesiastical laws by both Henry VIII and Edward VI, as well as the University of Cambridge; engaged with others in compiling the Common Prayer Book; became member of the privy council of Henry VIII and Edward VI, and by them was sent on various embassies and affairs of state; 1551, was made lord chancellor of England. Died Oct. 10, 1554. Mention of him is made in the history of Ely Cathedral, in the October number of the "Century," 1887, where he is called a great legal authority.

In "The Visitation of Yorkshire in 1584–5 and 1612, made by the *Herald's* Robert Glover and Richard St. George," edited by James Foster, 1875, London, it is said: "John Goodrich of Bollinbroke had son Edward Goodericke of Kirby, County Lincoln, who married Jane, dau. and heir of Williamson, Boston. Edward Goodericke had children: Mary, Henry, John, Thomas, and Elizabeth.

"Thomas was bishop of Ely and lord high chancellor of England, *tempus* Henry VIII and Edward VI.

"Henry had sons William, Richard, and Christopher, and one daughter Alborougha.

HISTORICAL INTRODUCTION.

"Richard had children: Richard, Henry, and Margaret. "Richard, the son, was knighted in Queen Elizabeth, 43d, and married Muriel, daughter of Lord William Evans, and had sons: William, Henry (knight of Ribston in 1612), Robert, Ralph, John, Richard, Francis, and daughter Margaret.

"Sir Henry Goodrick, knight of Ribston, married Jane, dau. of Sir John Savile of Methby, baron of the exchequer, and had children: Henry, Richard, Mary, Jane, and Elizabeth. (Title extinct in 1833.)

"The arms of Richard Goodrick, bart. and nephew of the bishop of Ely, were: Argent on a fess gules, between two lions passant, guardant sable, a fleur-de-lis between two crescents or. Crest: a demi-lion, rampant, guardant sable. Motto: Fare wel til then."

The following, copied by Com. Casper F. Goodrich, U.S.N., from a genealogical tree extending from 1465 to 1819, in possession of James Pitt Goodrich of Egarth House, Egarth, Denbighshire, England, corroborates the foregoing and gives some additional details:

"As early as 1465, Edward Goodrich of Kirby, Lincolnshire, baronet, married Jane, dau. and heiress of James Williamson, Esq. John Goodrich, first child of Edward and Jane (Williamson) Goodrich of Kirby, born 1485; married, 1507, Katherine Dymoke; was high-sheriff of Lincolnshire, 1535. Henry, second child of Edward and Jane Goodrich, born 1487; married, 1508, Margaret, dau. of Christopher Rawson; bought Ribston Manor, Yorkshire, from Charles Brandon, duke of Suffolk. Thomas, third child of Edward and Jane Goodrich, born 1489; bishop of Ely, etc. Katherine, fourth child of Edward and Jane, born 1492; married Sir Thomas Mussenden. Mary, fifth child of Edward and Jane, born 1495; unm.

"Richard, son of Henry and Margaret (Rawson) Goodrich, born 1510; married Clara, dau. of Richard Conyers, Esq., of Norton Conyers.

"Richard of Ribston, son of Richard and Clara (Con-

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yers) Goodrich, was high-sheriff of Yorkshire in 1580, and again in 1592; married Muriel, dau. of Rt.-Hon. Lord Wm. Evans.

"Sir Henry Goodrich, knight and baronet, son of Richard and Muriel (Evans) Goodrich, married Jane, dau. of Sir John Savile, baronet of the exchequer. John Goodrich, second son of Richard and Muriel (Evans) Goodrich, married ______, and emigrated to Virginia in 1635, and with him came Henry, Richard, John, and William."

Mrs. C. Stark Newell of Goshen, N.Y., only child of Dr. Chas. S. J. Goodrich of New York City, found among his papers after his decease the following document, given him by Judge Charles Goodrich of Pittsfield, Mass., who was the grandson of William, given to the doctor on his 11th birthday by the grandfather then 93 years of age. The document is as follows: "A man by the name of Goodrich married the Duke of Marlboro's sister. By her he had two sons: John, who was named for the duke, and William. The father died, and his brother brought John and William to New England. Not long after, the duke became childless, and sent over for John to return and become heir to his estates. John embarked for England, but died on the passage. The uncle purchased a farm for William in Wethersfield, Conn. This was about the year 1640." The only proof to be offered in support of the validity of this document is its internal evidence. It was made by David? who was nine years of age when his father died, of sufficient age to remember it, if heard, from his father's own lips; therefore it can not be traditional, nor can it be a forgery, for it was given by father to son, and at the same time it carries the record of both families of William¹ and David² which record is true in every particular; hence not a forgery.

The distracting discords, the acrimonious political and religious agitation that preceded and presaged the stormy conflict between the principles of kingly prerogative and civil and religious freedom, which culminated in the civil war between Charles I and the Parliament of England, created a wide-spread desire to escape the threatened conflict, by emigrating to the British colonies in North America, the whole of which were then called Virginia.

There were at least five original settlers of the name in New England prior to 1650, *viz.*:

1. William Goodrich (or Goodridge) of Watertown, Mass., 1636. A partial list of his descendants is given at page 356.

2. John Goodrich of Watertown, Mass., 1637; freeman, 1642. He is supposed to have been a brother of William above, and is said to have died on the return voyage to England in 1644. No descendants known. Perhaps he is the one referred to on page 18 as the son of Richard and Muriel (Evans) Goodrich.

3. Richard Goodrich of Guilford, Conn., 1639. (See page 350.) He may be the Richard who is said to have come with John, on page 18.

4. John Goodrich of Wethersfield, Conn., and William, his brother, whose ancestry is fully established, as shown in the following pages (pp. 19–25). William was the ancestor of nearly all of the name in America.

Abstract from Will of William Goodrich.

William Gooderich of Hegessett, in the County of Suffolk, yeoman, made April 4, 1631, and proved in the Archdeaconry Court of Sudbury, Feb. 2, 1631/2:

To John Gooderich, my son, all my houses, lands, and tenements in Hegessett aforesaid, both freehold and copyhold, and he to pay as render to my children, namely, to William Gooderich, my son, £16; to Elizabeth Clarke, my daughter, wife of Philip Clarke, £8; to Susan Beamand, my daughter, wife of John Beamand, £8. My son John Gooderich to be executor. In the presence of John Whyte; the mark of John Bewley, the mark of Richard Sharpe, the mark of John Copley.

THE GOODRICH FAMILY.

WILL OF JOHN GODERICH.

John Goderich of Burie St. Edmond, in the County of Suffolk, clothier, dated April 14, 1632, and proved in the Archdeaconry Court of Sudbury, May 16, 1632:

"ffirst and principallie I comend my sowle into the hands of the Almightie God, my Creator, and to Jesus Christ, his onlye sonne, my lord and onlye Saviour, by the merits of whose death and passion I steadfastlie beleeve to have free p'don and forgivenes of all my synnes, and to be made p'taker of the joyes of heaven." To Margerie, my wife, my house wherein I now dwell in Bury, and my land in Horningherth, in the County of Suffolk, for her life, and on her death to descend to my four sons, William Gooderiche the elder, William Gooderiche the younger, John Gooderich, and Jeremy Gooderich. To my son John Gooderich, my house or tenement and lands in Hessett, in the said County of Suffolk, my said wife to have the profits till my son John Gooderich shall attain twenty-one. If he die without lawful issue under twenty-one, then the property to him bequeathed to descend and come to the said William Gooderich the elder, Wm. Gooderich the younger, and Jeremy Gooderich, to be equally divided amongst them. To my said three sons, William Gooderich the elder, William Gooderich the younger, and Jeremy Gooderich, one hundred pounds apiece at twenty-one. If any die under twenty-one and without issue, then the portion or legacy of him or them so dying shall come to the rest of my said sons. My wife to have the managing of the portions during minority, and the increase and benefit arising from their said several portions to be for their education and maintenance, and for binding of any of them forth apprentices, and the residue to be delivered to my sons at the time limited for payment of the portions. If any of my said children prove rebellious, stubborn, and disobedient, and refuse to be maintained, ordered, and governed according to my said wive's discretion, or the discretion of such others as during their minority shall have the managing of their said portions, in case my wife die, then the profits and increase of his or their portions that shall so misdemean shall go to the others of them that are dutiful and obedient. Provided that my wife do pay all such legacies contained in my father's will, which on

my part are yet to be paid. To Margaret, daughter of my brother Henry Gooderich, five pounds at 24, and to William Gooderich, son of my said brother Henry Gooderich, five pounds at 24, with benefit of survivorship. To the two younger children of my sister Susan, by her first husband John Lark, forty shillings apiece at 24, with benefit of survivorship. To the poor of the parish of St. Mary in Bury, forty shillings to be distributed one month after my decease. To the poor spinners of Drinkstone, in the County of Suffolk, twenty shillings to be distributed within a month after my decease. All the rest of my goods, chattels, wares, stock, plate, household stuff, and moveables to Margerie, my wife, whom I make sole executrix. Thomas Chaplyne, mercer, Clement Chaplyne, brother of said Thomas, Jeremy Stafford, mercer, and my cousin, Robert Gooderich of Bury St. Edmunds, aforesaid supervisors, and for their pains I give to every one forty shillings. If my wife die before the will is fully performed, and have not nominated any person or persons for the performance thereof, then my said supervisors to take upon them the performance, and shall also have the managing and employment of all such portions as shall come to any of my said children after the decease of my said wife. Witness: Richard Cooper Harman, by mark; the mark of Robert Brightnall, Philip Crowe.

From the "Parish Register," of St. Mary, Bury St. Edmunds:

"BURIAL.—April 21, 1632, John Goderich, Clothyer."

WILL OF REV. WILLIAM GOODRICH.*

Rev. William Goodrich of Hegessett, in the County of Suffolk, dated May 12, 1677, and proved July 1, 1678, in the Archdeaconry Court of Sudbury:

"In the name of God, Amen. I William Goodrich of Hegessett, in the county of Suffolk, clerk, being through the mercy of God of sound mind, and good health and disposing memory, do make and ordain this my last will in manner and form following, *Imprimis*, I give unto

Rebecca, my loving wife, all my messuages wherein I now dwell, in Hegessett aforesaid, with all the houses, out-houses, and gardens, lands and appurtenances thereunto belonging, to hold to her assigns, for and during the term of her natural life, she keeping the same from time to time in good repair; and, after my said wife's decease, I give the same messuages, tenements, houses, out-houses, gardens, orchards, and appurtenances thereto belonging, unto Joseph, the eldest son now living of my brother John Goodrich, and his heirs forever. But in case he dies and have no issue from his own body. I give the aforesaid houses and lands, with all their appurtenances before mentioned, or not mentioned, belonging to me in Hegessett, to my brother's next son, Jonathan, and his heirs; and if he also be dead before my wife, and have no natural issue of his body, I give the appurtenances named, or not named, belonging to me in Hegessett, unto my brother John's eldest daughter, and her heirs, that shall be then living. Also, I give unto Rebecca, my loving wife, all that Copyhold Close, called by the name of Robbetts, containing by estimation seven acres, more or les, lying in Chilton Hamlet, in Stowmarket, in the County of Suffolk, holden of the monor of Dagworth cum Sorrells to hold to her and her assigns for and during the term of her natural life, and after my said wife's decease, I give the aforesaid close, with all the appurtenances thereof, to John, the eldest son of my brother William Goodrich, and his heirs forever. Also, I give unto Rebecca, my wife, all the closes mortgaged to me by John Tillicot, of Bayton, now deceased, for fifty pounds, and seized upon by me for the lack of the payment of the principal.

"All these closes, as they are mentioned in the indenture made to me, with their appurtenances, I give to the said Rebecca, my wife, during the term of hir natural life; but in case the land be redeemed, and the fifty pounds paid, with the interest that is, or shall be, due to me, my will is that my wife shall have the interest and improvement thereof toward her maintainence during her life. But my will is, that after her decease, that all the closes of the aforesaid John Tillicot, mortgaged to me, and seized upon by me for want of payment of the aforesaid principal, shall descend to John Goodrich, the eldest son of my brother William Goodrich, and his heirs. But if redeemed, I will

and devise to the aforesaid John (Goodrich), and to his heirs, after my wife's decease fifty pounds, of lawful English money, in the room of the land; and whereas I have sundry sums of money abroad in several hands, I will and devise concerning the same that my said wife shall have the interest and improvement thereof toward her maintenance during her life. But my will is, that the aforesaid fifty pounds, in case paid, and the aforesaid land of John Tillicot be redeemed, and, besides that, an hundred and fifty pounds more I have abroad, to be well secured by my wife, within three months after my decease; the above-named fifty pounds for the use(.....) forenamed John Goodrich, eldest son of my brother William (Goodrich), and his heirs (.....) forever; out of the hundred and fifty pounds, after my wife's decease, I will and devise one fifty pounds to the above said John, eldest son of my brother William Goodrich, and his heirs forever; and as for the other hundred pounds, I will and devise the same unto Joseph, the eldest son of my brother John Goodrich, and to his heirs forever; after the decease of my wife. And do farther will that whenever Mr. John Tillicot's land be redeemed, and the fifty pounds paid in. that the said fifty pounds shall be put out for the better improvement of my wife's maintainence; but no part or parcel of it, but by, and with, the consent of my kinsman, Henry Bull, senior, of Bury, Malster, and John Goodrich, eldest son now living of my cousin Robert Goodrich, Hawleigh, Chirurgeon, and after the same manner shall the hundred and fifty pounds before mentioned be disposed of for the maintainence of my said wife. No part of the same to be put out, or altered out of the present hands where it now is, but by, and with, the consent of Henry Bull of Bury and John Goodrich of Hawleigh, that so the principal sum may be preserved for the aforesaid John Goodrich, eldest son of my brother William Goodrich, and his heirs, and Joseph Goodrich, eldest son of my brother John Goodrich, and his heirs: and in case of her disposal of the said two hundred pounds, or any part thereof, without the consent of the aforesaid Henry Bull and John Goodrich, then I will that my said two brothers' children, Joseph and John, or their heirs living, shall immediately from and after such disposal have and enjoy the two hundred pounds, according to my mind and purpose above said, either of them their appointed

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part and share. And it is further my will that my said wife do, before she enjoy any benefit of this my will, first enter into a bond of four hundred pounds to the said Henry Bull and Jphn Goodrich, that her executors and administrators shall pay to the above-named loseph and John, within three months after her decease, the two hundred pounds, in case the land of John Tillicot be redeemed and the principal paid; or elso one hundred and fifty pounds if they shall come so soon out of New England to receive the same, or by sufficient or undoubted authority they send for the same, or else so soon as they shall send for it. Item. It is my will that all the overplus of my estate, either goods or money, or household stuff, or chattels whatsoever, shall be to and for the use and benefit of my wife, and at her disposal, to whom I give the same, and constitute and appoint the said Rebecca. my wife, sole executrix of this my last will and testament, and I nominate the said Henry Bull and John Goodrich supervisors thereof. Also, my mind and will is that John Bull, reader, of Bury, in the parish of St. James, and the son of Henry Bull, aforesaid, these books named by mine own hand in the margin of my will, which my executrix, after my death, shall deliver to him. In witness of all this, I, the said William Goodrich, have to this my last will and testament, contained in sheet of paper, set my hand and seal, dated the 12th day of May, in the year of our Lord. 1677. "WILLIAM GOODRICH."

"From BURY, ye 16th of July, 1678.

"Cozen GOODRICH:—This is to inform you that your brother William Goodrich is dead. He died in Hegessett, near Bury in the County of Suffolk, and left no children. The sum of his last will and testament is this: He has given to his wife all, during her natural life, and, after her decease, he has bequeathed to your relations as follows: to Joseph, the eldest son of his brother John, he has given his house and grounds at Hegessett, above said, and one hundred pounds in money, if the said Joseph shall then be living; and, for want of heirs, to Jonathan, the 2d son of his brother John, and his heirs; and if he also died childless, then the bequeathment is to descend to the eldest daughter of his brother John, and her heirs.

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"He has also given one Copyhold ground, in value near one hundred pounds, and 100 in money to John, the eldest son of his brother William, if he shall be living at the decease of his said wife, and otherwise it is to descend to William, the son of his brother William, and his heirs forever.

"All to be enjoyed after the death of his wife, whom he has appointed sole executrix, and engaged to enter into a bond of 400 pounds (before she has any benefit of this will), to perform the conditions of it; which bond is to be sealed to myself and one Mr. John Goodrich of Hawleigh, whom he has appointed supervisors, in order to the security of the 200 pounds above mentioned, which is abroad at interest. But how it shall be made strong enough to tie her from the embezzlement of it (if she should be so disposed), I know not, unless there be some deputation from the persons concerned. My desire, therefore, is that you would depute some trusty friend, whom you may confide in, under the hands and seals of the persons concerned, to take such order for the security of it as they shall find expedient. Your brother was so careful of securing it, that in case of the widow's disposal of any part thereof, without my consent and the consent of Mr. John Goodrich, she should, ipso facto, be deprived of it, and the above-named Joseph and John should immediately enjoy it. I should have sent you a copy of the Will, had it not been too tedious; but the contents of it you have faithfully delivered. My wife is yet living, who was your cousin Jane Coates, and desires to be kindly remembered to you.

"I am your affectionate and loving kinsman,

"HENRY BULL."

"November 13, 1692.

"Cozen GOODRICH:—-Yours I received, inclosed in a letter, and your aunt is in good health. You desire me to send you two or three lines, who is appointed to look after, your estate, in case I should depart this life before your aunt. My own son John, a minister, and Thomas Winlock, my son-in-law, who married my daughter, are entrusted for this business of yours, who I know will be very faithful in mine and your concern. Thus hoping of your health and well being, as blessed be God I enjoy, is all at present. "From your loving friend and kinsman, Upprov Burt."

THE GOODRICH FAMILY.

"BURY, November 24, 1698.

"BROTHER JOHN:—My kind love to you, and yours; this is to desire you to send to my Cousins, the Goodriches, to let them know their Aunt is dead, and was buried, the 18th day of this instant, November; and I will be glad to see them, and that they have their due. I have met with a great deal of trouble, and would be glad, if it please God to see them, for at this time I am not well myself. But desire them that they may bring over with them a note from the Chief of the place, with such seal of the County, as they sent me to act for them, in Oct. /78. That they, or we, may have [no] trouble here; and this all at present, from your loving brother to command. HENRY BULL."

"Brother pray, if this letter come to your hand, and they come over to Bury, to send me your letter, that I may know they are the men concerned with me, for I know not any of them."

EXTRACT FROM CERTIFICATE:

"1703. May 20. William Warner, æ. about 57, and Thomas Wells, æ. about 41, both residents of Wethersfield, before Gov. Winthrop, that they were personally acquainted with John Goodrich, Husbandman, late of Westhersfield, deceased, and that he sometime had a son Joseph, and that said Joseph had been dead about 22 years, and died without issue, and that said John Goodrich, left another son Jonathan, who now is, since the death of Joseph], his reported only surviving son, and that Jonathan aforesaid of Wethersfield, Tailor; claims certain estate lying in Hegessett, England. And that the said Jonathan, who was here present at the signing of this Certificate, being about the age of 38 years, is married, and has several children, and is the one alluded to. I. WINTHROP."

"MANOR OF DAGWORTH CUM SORRELLS."

Abstracts from the Court Rolls:

"In the year 1680, Rebecca Goodrich was admitted tenant for life upon the death and under the will of her husband, William Goodrich of Hessett, Suffolk, to the close called Robbetts."

"At a General Court Baron held for the Manor, October 17, 1699, John Goodrich was admitted tenant to the same close under the will before mentioned, and upon the death of Rebecca Goodrich."

"At a General Court Baron held for the Manor, July 3, 1718, it was presented by the homage, and also certified by the steward, that on the 26th day of March, 1717. Thomas Evans of Bury St. Edmunds, in the County of Suffolk, gentleman, personally came before the steward, and by virtue of an authority to him given by John Goodrich of Wethersfield, in the County of Hartford, in the Colony of Conneticott, in New England, and in consideration of £55 to him paid by Benjamin Tompson of Norton, in the County of Suffolk, gentleman, surrendered by the rod into the hands of the Lord of the Manor, all that close called Robbetts, containing by estimation seven acres (more or less) lying in Chilton Hamlet, in the parish of Stowmarket, held by Copy of Court Roll of the said Manor. To the behoof and use of the said Benjamin Tompson, his heirs and assigns; and the said Benjamin Tompson was therefore admitted tenant to said premises,"

From the authenticated documents and facts above stated, the names and residence of the family of our ancestors are determined beyond all reasonable doubt, and any one desirous of tracing up their descent to any earlier period, and willing to devote the time or bear the necessary expense required to do so, is here furnished with a certain starting-point, from which, through the registry of births, marriages, deaths, and wills, the line may be traced to the period when the law first required such facts to be recorded.

THE ENGLISH HOME OF THE AMERICAN EMIGRANTS.

The English home of John and William Goodrich of Wethersfield, Conn., having been conclusively established, a few words concerning Hegessett (now called Hessett) and Bury St. Edmunds may be of interest to the reader.

Hessett is a typical Suffolk village, and Suffolk is unquestionably one of the most English of English counties. The parish is six miles east of Bury St. Edmunds, in a district thoroughly rural and agricultural. The church is a handsome structure, which may be referred to the early part of the fifteenth century, with portions of more ancient date. It exhibits excellent and skilful masonry of cut flints, which is a marked characteristic of Suffolk churches. The initials "I. B.," artistically disposed on either side of the porch and in other parts of the church, no doubt refer to some member of the Bacon family, and indicate that to him the building of the church is due. In the interior is a monument with a Latin inscription commemorating Lionel Bacon, Esq., from which we learn that the family of Bacon was seated in the parish from the reign of Henry II to the year 1651, and is the root whence sprung Francis Bacon, Viscount St. Albans.

Bury St. Edmunds is of very ancient origin, and it is supposed the Britons had a town upon or in the immediate vicinity of the site of the present place. The erection of a Christian church here in the seventh century, by King Sigebercht, the first Christian king of East Anglia, probably the first Christian church in the district, shows it to have been a place of consideration. The body of the martyred king Edmund was buried here, and from that time the place was called St. Edmund's Bury, until the fifteenth century, when it began to take its present name. The principal objects of interest to the antiquarian are the ruins of the abbey, founded in 637 by King Sigebercht, the ruins still remaining, being those of the third abbey church built by Baldwin and consecrated in 1095. Its length was 505 feet, the nave being 33 feet broad, and the upper transepts 246 feet from north to south. The abbey gate, the principal entrance to the monastery, opened into the great court before the abbot's palace, and was erected after the destruction, by the towns-people in 1327, of a previous gateway, and completed about 1377. It is one of the purest specimens of the decorated style of pointed architecture. The tracery is exquisitely wrought and the western front is richly ornamented. The gate-house is 50 feet long, 41 feet broad, and 62 feet high. Portions of the abbey wall still remain, and the abbot's bridge, composed of three arches across the River Lark and in continuation of the wall, was erected in the early part of the thirteenth century.

St. Mary's Church is a fine specimen of the perpendicular style, and was built in the beginning of the fifteenth century, portions of it, however, being of an earlier date. The roof of the nave is the most perfect, and one of the finest, if not the finest, specimen in the world of the open timber roof. Entering the church by the west doorway, the visitor can not fail to be impressed by the *coup-d'avil* of this magnificent church.

The Norman tower, erected during the time of Abbot Baldwin, about 1090, as the principal entrance to the Cemetery of St. Edmund, is immediately opposite the west entrance to the abbey church, It is 86 feet high and 36 feet square, and the walls are nearly six feet in thickness. The porch on the western side is a unique specimen of Norman architecture.

Many other objects of interest, ancieut and modern, are to be seen in Bury St. Edmunds. For a detailed account, the reader is referred to "A Hand-book of Bury St. Edmunds," by Samuel Tymms, F.S.A., London, 1883, from which the above has been taken. THE GOODRICH FAMILY.

William¹ Goodrich, born in England, probably in or near Bury St. Edmunds, County Suffolk; brother of John¹; probably came to America at the same time as his brother. The first entry on the Conn. He purchased a large tract of land in Pontoosuc-now

Pittsfield-Mass., there being but a single house in the town when he built his where the village of Pittsfield now stands. The country was a dense wilderness, without a single road. Solomon Deming had preceded him, and opened a trail to his rude home. He introduced the first cart and plow into the town, and held the plow that turned the first furrow; and sowed the first seed with his own hand. He was a member of the provincial congress in 1774; was engaged in the battle of Bennington, Vt.; always prominent in public life: the magistrate of his town, county judge, a member for years of the early State legislature; a firm believer in the ordinances of revealed religion as he saw it, and did not hesitate to openly declare it. At the age of seventy-five years he made his famous ride on a Narragansett pony from his own home in Pittsfield, Mass., to Pittsfield, Vt., over one hundred miles in one day, to the home of his son James; and the knowledge of his arrival at night was made known by his shouting "Fire"—having seen on his approach a building in flames. His son heard the shout from his own house, fully three-quarters of a mile distant, and recognized his father's voice. At the semi-centennial celebration of the incorporation of the town, and the first agricultural fair, he was drawn through the streets by fifty yoke of oxen, standing on a stone drag holding a plow; then at the age of ninetysix years. He died the following year.

Wait⁴ Goodrich was born in Wethersfield, Conn.; began active life as a sailor; became master of a vessel in the West Indies trade; had his home in Wethersfield, where all his children were born and baptized. During the Revolutionary War he was captain of commissary, stationed at Woodbury, Conn.; Dec. 18, 1780, he was allowed on hispay-table \pounds 3000 for purchasing pork for the army; was inspector of gunpowder and reinspector of saltpetre at the powder mills in the State. All of his sons began their active life on their father's vessel with him: Jeduthan, the eldest, became a ship-master when in his twentyfirst year, and during that year captured a British vessel and brought it into port—relics taken from that vessel are still in the possession of Goodrich families in Connecticut; he died on board of his vessel off the coast of Africa, and was buried on shore. Grove, the second son, was first mate when lost overboard in a heavy gale, on Dec. 22, 1786. Anson, the third son, was also a ship-master; died on board of his vessel at Cape Francis. Of all this family of twelve children there were no descendants save from Lucretia, who married Frederic Baldwin; she died at Catskill, N.Y., March 26, 1834. 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Elizur⁴ Goodrich (David³ David² William¹), born in Wethersfield, Conn., Oct. 6, 1734; graduated at Yale in 1752, and was tutor there in 1755; deeply interested in mathematics and astronomy, and in the busiest scenes of his subsequent ministry rarely failed to calculate the eclipse of each successive year; and when the aurora borealis of 1780 made its appearance, he drew up one of the fullest and most accurate accounts of it ever published, with exact drawings of the auroral arch. In November, 1756, he was ordained minister of the Congregational Church in Durham, Conn., in which office he continued till his death, Nov. 21, 1797. He was an accomplished teacher, having prepared some three hundred young men for college and public life. In 1776, he was elected into the corporation of Yale College; was an active friend of the Revolution, preaching on the right of resistance and urging his people to lay down their property and lives in the conflict. He published several sermons, and left behind him some hundreds of elaborate essays on difficult passages of Scripture. He married, Feb. 1, 1759, Katherine, daughter of Hon. We have it from undoubted authority that one of the most effectual blows given the enemy on that day was by Goodrich; not having shot at hand quite as fast as he wanted, and in his haste was reckless enough to use a bar of iron in place of shot, the effect of which was to carry away the main-mast of the enemy's flag-ship, which materially served to gain the victory, which was reported by Com. Perry in these concise words: "We have met the enemy and they are ours." For bravery exhibited in this engagement, the State of Pennsylvania awarded Mr. Goodrich a silver medal, which is now in the possession of his grandson, Frank W. Goodrich, Marshalltown, Iowa. 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Chauncey⁵ **Goodrich** (Elizur,⁴ David,³ David,² William¹), born Oct. 20, 1759, in Durham, Conn.; died in Hartford, Conn., Aug. 18, 1815; graduated at Yale in 1779; was tutor there for the next two years, and then began the practice of law in Hartford, where he soon rose to eminence; was a member of the State legislature in 1793, and in 1794 was elected to congress, where he served six years.

[From Appendix to Hollister's "History of Connecticut":]

"For this station he was peculiarly qualified, not only by the original bent of his mind and his habits of study, but also by the fact that having married into the family of the second Gov. Wolcott, he was brought into the closest relations with public men and measures, which naturally led him to familiarize himself with all the great questions of the day. This led him, from the time he took his seat in Congress, to become intimately acquainted with the plans and policy of the administration, and he gave them his warmest support.

"A party in opposition to Gen. Washington was now organized for the first time in Congress. Mr. Goodrich took a large share in the debates which followed, and gained the respect of all parties by his characteristic dignity, candor, and force of judgment, and especially by his habit of contemplating a subject on every side and discussing it in its remotest relations and dependencies. Mr. Albert Gallatin, then the most active leader of the opposition, remarked to a friend near the close of his life that in these debates he usually selected the speech of Chauncey Goodrich as the object of reply, feeling that if he could answer *him* he would have met every thing truly relevant to the subject which had been urged on the part of the government.

"In 1801, he resigned his seat in Congress and returned

to the practice of the law at Hartford. The next year he was chosen to the office of councillor (afterward senator) in the State legislature, which he continued to fill until 1807, when he was elected to the Senate of the United States. During the violent conflicts of the next six years he took an active part in the discussions which arose out of the embargo, the non-intercourse laws, and other measures which led to the war with Great Britain.

"The same qualities which marked his early efforts were now more fully exhibited in the maturity of his powers, while the whole cast of his character made him peculiarly fitted for the calmer deliberations of the Senate. He had nothing of what Burke calls 'the smartness of debate.' He never indulged in sarcasm or personal attacks. In the most stormy discussions he maintained a courtesy which disarmed rudeness. Mr. Jefferson playfully said to a friend during this period, 'That white-headed Yankee from Connecticut is the most difficult man to deal with in the Senate of the United States.' In 1812, he was chosen mayor of the city of Hartford; and on the year following, being elected lieutenant-governor of his native State, he resigned his seat in the senate. The two last-named offices he retained until his death.

"At a meeting of the legislature in 1814, he was appointed a delegate to the celebrated Hartford Convention. Though in feeble health, he took a large share in the deliberation of that body, and especially in those healing measures which were finally adopted."

He married first, Abigail, daughter of Dr. Smith of Hartford; married second, Mary Ann Wolcott, Oct. 13, 1789, daughter of Gov. Oliver Wolcott and Laura Collins, died in 1805.

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Elizur⁵ Goodrich (Elizur⁴ David³ David² William¹), born in Durham, Conn., March 24, 1761; died in New Haven, Conn., Nov. 1, 1849; graduated at Yale in 1779, and was tutor there for the next two years; received LL.D. in 1830. "On the landing of the troops, July 5, 1779, he joined a company of about a hundred in number, who went out, under the command of James Hillhouse, to annoy and retard the march of the enemy. Toward evening, when the town was taken and given up to ravage and plunder, he was stabbed near the heart by a British soldier, as he lay on his bed in a state of extreme exhaustion, and barely escaped with his life."

He began the practice of law in New Haven in 1783; was chosen a member of congress in 1799, and in 1801 was appointed collector of the port of New Haven; was also for many years in the legislature of Connecticut; was judge of the county court for thirteen and judge of probate for seventeen years, and mayor of New Haven from 1803 to 1822; was professor of law in Yale College for nine years, resigning the office in 1810.

Mr. Goodrich was distinguished for exact scholarship, the clearness and strength of his judgment, and the ease and accuracy with which he transacted business. "His reading was extensive and minute; and what is unusual, he maintained his acquaintance with the ancient classics to the last, being accustomed to read the writings of Cicero, Livy, Sallust, Virgil, and Horace till his eightyninth year, with all the ease and interest of his early days."

His cordial manner, extensive information, and genial humor, combined with unusual conversational powers, made his presence in society particularly agreeable. He professed his faith in Christ soon after leaving college, and his life throughout was that of a consistent and earnest Christian. He married Anne Willard Allen of Great Barrington, Mass., Sept. Joseph⁶ Goodrich (Uriah⁵ Elijah⁴ Jacob³ John² William¹), born March 12, 1800; died Oct. 9, 1867; at the age of 19 years he left his home in Stephentown, N.Y., and traveled on foot to Alfred, Cattaraugus County; on his arrival here, he found himself the possessor of an axe, fifty cents in his pocket, and the clothes he wore. During the next six years he cleared off two farms, settled on the second, broke up a few acres, and erected a saw-mill; his house was made of rough boards, without a floor; a blanket serving the place of a door; this was the home to which he brought his young wife. He soon after opened a small store and a temperance tavern in the place, and in addition to his general business he began buying lumber and rafting it down the Susquehanna River, but with poor success, owing to the losses not unfrequently sustained on the passage down to market. This fact determined him to seek a new home farther west, and he left for Milwaukee, and starting out from there with others, on foot, went to the DuLac Prairie; he settled here, and at once began the erection of a dwelling, to which he brought his goods and family from Alfred, N.Y., with teams, in the year 1839, to the place now known as Milton, Wis. This home served for a dwelling, store, tavern, and place for public worship on the Sabbath.

On the first Sabbath after his arrival, both the old and the young were gathered into his house, and there they entered into a compact-professors and non-professorsto maintain religious meetings, bible-class, abstain from hunting and roaming about the fields on the Sabbath, and to watch over each other for good. Religious services were held in his house until he had finished the building known as the Milton Academy, when they were held there, and continued to be until 1851. He donated twenty acres to the village of Milton, which now constitutes the public square; and to the cemetery association, public school, college, and one of the churches, all of their grounds. One of the most conspicuous objects in the vicinity is the Goodrich Block. He represented his assembly district in the State legislature by the unanimous vote of the district. He erected Milton Academy building at his own expense; employed a principal, managed and supported the school unaided for more than eight years. He was president of the board of trustees from the time of its incorporation until 1866, when the institution was incorporated as a college. He declined the same position on the new board by reason of age. He endowed the institution with several thousand dollars, and lived to see it become one of the most flourishing in the State. He was through his whole life a genuine, practical reformer; reform was his motto. For over forty years he sustained and kept a strictly temperance hotel; a life-long abolitionist; the poor he never turned away from his door and table. Wheeler of New York City, under the chartered name of "The Glendale Woolen Company," in which he was concerned during the largest portion of his after-life. In 1848, he received the degree of M.A. from Williams College; elected State senator. In 1850, elected to represent the eleventh district in Congress, where he was continued for two successive terms. He was one of the leaders in the organization of the Republican party in 1856; elected lieutenant-governor of Massachusetts in 1860; appointed one of the peace commissioners by Gov. Andrews, to meet in Richmond, Va.; elected presidential elector the same year, and cast his vote for Abraham Lincoln; appointed collector of the port of Boston in 1861, which position he held for four years; after which he retired to his home in Stockbridge. President of the Housatonic Railway Co.; trustee of Williams College, and other like institutions; his income he devoted largely to public benefactions. In 1863-4, he erected a large, handsome, two-story stone building, donating the first floor to the town of Stockbridge for a public library, and the upper floor to the Congregational church in perpetuo; to Williams College he gave \$55,000. was from teachers in his father's house, employed for part of the year. At a later period he began the study of the classics and higher English branches with J. C. Center. After nearly two years, active symptoms of consumption -the family scourge-appeared, and he sought relief on one of his brother's vessels, engaged in the carrying-trade on the lakes, which proved so beneficial that the next year he entered the Westfield Academy, where he completed his preparatory studies, and then commenced the study of the law with Dixon & Smith, with whom he remained until the spring of 1834, when he started for Chicago, arriving May 14; and shortly after, formed a law partnership with Alex. N. Fullerton, which continued for something over one year. He engaged in real-estate speculalation and acquired what was then deemed a handsome fortune; but the great financial crash of 1837 found him with large liabilities—some of his own, but largely as security for others; he asked and received no compromise, sought the shelter of no bankrupt law, but devoted nearly seventeen years of labor to their extinguishment, and paid them all principal and interest.

In the fall of 1835, he formed a law partnership with Giles Spring, which continued until 1849, when Spring was elected judge of Cook County Court of Common Pleas. The firm of Spring & Goodrich attained a wide professional reputation and an extensive practice. In 1854, he entered into partnership with W. W. Farwell, and, in 1856, Sidney Smith was admitted into the firm, constituting the firm of Goodrich, Farwell & Smith, which transacted a large business in the State and United-States courts, occupying the position of one of the leading law firms of Chicago. The unremitting labor of so many years began to tell upon his health, and by advice of his physician, in 1858, he went to Europe. After his return, in 1859, he was elected one of the judges of the Superior Court of Chicago, which position he held between four and five years, when he returned to the bar, resuming his place in the old firm of Goodrich, Farwell & Smith; which continued until 1869, when it was dissolved, and he retired from general practice, engaging only in special cases. In common with hundreds of others, he saw the accumulations of years of toil swept away in the great Chicago fire of October 9, 1871. To retrieve something of his losses, he again entered into active practice; but after five years of intense and successful professional labor, his nervous system gave way, and his prostration became so complete that he was forced to abandon all professional labor.

As a citizen, Mr. Goodrich has been active in promoting the material, moral, and religious interests of Chicago. He served as alderman the second year of its existence as a city; was one of the first members of the school board, and helped to lay the foundations of its splendid schoolsystem; he aided in organizing the first temperance society and the first bible society in Chicago, and is now a lifemember and vice-president of the American Bible-Society. He has been a trustee and the secretary of Rush Medical College from its foundation. To provide facilities for higher education in the Northwest, he, in association with Hon. John Evans, Orrington Lunt, and others, procured the charter of and established the Northwestern University at Evanston, and by personal contributions, the pledge of their individual credit, their unremitted labors, watchful care, and judicious management of its financial interests, secured its endowment and the honorable reputation it bears. The university has conferred on Mr. Goodrich the degree of LL.D. He was perhaps more largely instrumental than any one else in inducing the late Eliza Garrett to project and endow the Garrett Biblical Institute at Evanston, for the education and theological training of young men for the Christian ministry, which has been in successful operation for thirty years. With others he prevented the sale of the lot owned by the First M.-E. Church of Chicago, now in the business centre of the city, and drew and helped to obtain a special charter for the erection thereon of a building for business as well as church purposes, from which rents have been received, and paid for the founding of other churches, amounting to \$300,000. He was one of the projectors of the founding of the Washingtonian Home of Chicago, for the cure of inebriates.

Belonging to the same political party with Mr. Lincoln, and having been associated with him in important lawsuits, he became one of his earliest and most ardent . admirers and advocates of his nomination for president. On the breaking out of the Rebellion, he was an active member of the Union Defence Committee of Chicago, which organized, fed, fitted out, and sent to the field several regiments of men, who rushed to the defence of the Union, before the government was able to organize or care for them; and when the emancipation proclamation set the slaves free, he acted as a member of the Freedman's Aid Society in caring for them; and until the failure of his health, there were few charitable or religious benevolences which did not receive his best thought and active support, and in which he does not still retain a lively interest. He has seen what few living men have seen, or will ever see, a frontier hamlet, containing only eight frame dwellings, grow into a city of nearly 800,000 inhabitants. He has been a member of the Methodist-Episcopal church since 1832. He married, July 24, 1836, Juliet Atwater of Westfield, N.Y., daughter of Amos Atwater and Mary Woodside.

The following biographical sketch of Gideon⁵ Goodrich, father of Grant⁶ inadvertantly omitted in its proper place, is here inserted: (See page 114.) In his native town of Rocky Hill, Conn., he learned the trade of a tanner, currier, and shoemaker; shortly after his majority, he settled in Milton, Saratoga County, N.Y., where he successfully practised his trade until 1815, when he sold most of his property and purchased several tracts of land in Ripley, Chautauqua County, N.Y., where he established two of his sons in his own trade, and aided in clearing farms for others—himself cultivating a large farm for several years, and afterward, with one of his sons, engaged in the warehouse and forwarding business at what was then known as Portland Harbor; when failing health compelled him to retire from all active pursuits.

He was a man of marked ability, force of character, public spirit, and general information; especially interested in promoting education and its facilities; he was active and liberal in the founding of Milton Academy, where some very prominent men received their early training. He was colonel of militia a number of years, and represented Saratoga County in the State legislature, in association with such men as Samuel Young, ---- Cady, and • others. He was ingenious, and a man of resources. One of his sons was born with a club-foot, and at that day surgical science had discovered no remedy for such a malfor-The painful thought that his son should be mation. doomed a cripple for life, induced him to ponder upon a remedy, and he invented an appliance by which the foot was straightened and the defect effectually cured. The knowledge of his success brought numerous like cases to him for treatment from near and remote distances, down to nearly the close of his life, affording him great satisfaction in relieving a large number of children from a similar deformity. He was always prominent in public and political affairs, and possessed the confidence and esteem of his acquaintances.

He was elected professor of rhetoric and oratory in Yale College in 1817, but relinquished the office in 1839, to accept the chair of pastoral theology in the Theological Seminary, a position which he occupied until his death—during a period of twenty years. In 1820, he was elected president of Williams College, but declined the appointment. The degree of Doctor of Divinity was conferred on him by Brown University in 1835.

His literary labors were various and uniformly successful. In 1814, he prepared a Greek grammar, which was generally used and was printed in several editions. In 1827, he superintended the abridgement of Webster's quarto American Dictionary, which was so widely circulated throughout the country. In 1829, he established the quarterly "Christian Spectator," which he edited for nearly ten years with great labor, zeal, and enterprise, under circumstances occasioning much anxiety to himself and his This review exerted great influence upon the friends. religious discussions of the day, and in its support Prof. Goodrich had the help of the ablest pens at Yale. In 1832, he prepared a series of Latin lessons, and soon after, a like series of Greek lessons for beginners, both of which works have passed through several editions. In 1846-7, he revised both editions of the unabridged and abridged dictionaries of Webster, and, in 1856, the University edition of the same work. In 1859, he prepared an appendix for the pictorial edition of ten thousand new words and definitions, with a full and complete dictionary of synonyms. In 1852, he published his admirable work on "British Eloquence," which is superior to anything else of the kind. It received the warm commendation of Hon, Rufus Choate and Lord Campbell of England, excited elaborate notices in the English quarterlies, has been extensively circulated, and always highly commended. Besides performing the literary labor involved in preparing and editing these various works, Prof. Goodrich was prominently connected with many of the most important benevolent societies of the country, especially that of the American Board of Commissioners for Foreign Missions.

Samuel Griswold⁶ Goodrich (Samuel⁵ Elizur⁴ David³ David² William¹), born in Ridgefield, Conn., Aug. 19, 1793; at an early age he was very fond of study, and eagerly read every book within his reach. At 15 years of age he left home to earn his living in Danbury, Conn.; and, while faithful to duty, pursued his studies as best he could, and with such zeal that midnight study told upon his health and impaired his sight for life. In 1811, he worked in Hartford, where he joined a literary society and enjoyed the helpful friendship of Miss Huntley, afterward Mrs. Sigourney. In 1812, he had a taste of war, his company of artillery being ordered to New London, where some British ships lay in the offing; but he saw no real fighting.

THE GOODRICH FAMILY.

At the time of the famous Hartford Convention he lived with his uncle, Gov. Chauncey Goodrich, then mayor, and knew and studied that brilliant circle of men. In 1818, he married, and settled in Hartford as a publisher, where he saw the dawn of American literature. At this time, few works were issued in this country save reprints of English books. He published "Trumbull's Poems," paying the author \$1000 and one hundred copies of the printed book. He now began to write short stories for children.

In 1823, he went to Europe for the benefit of his health. On his return he settled in Boston, where he wrote his first Parley book, "Tales of the Sea," the success of which may be said to have been equalled only by that of the volumes which followed it. He often wrote fourteen hours a day, much of this by dictation to his wife, she seated in the light, he behind a screen, in constant fear of blindness. This labor brought on heart trouble, and in 1832 he again visited Europe for advice. He consulted many specialists. who, although they contradicted each other on some points, gave him reason to hope that he might live to the age of sixty. He carried very flattering letters of introduction on this journey. Oliver Wolcott, governor of Connecticut, spoke of him as "a gentleman of good habits and perfect integrity," and again as "possessing accomplished manners and address"; John Ouincy Adams sent him three letters; Dewitt Clinton presented him to John Jacob Astor; Timothy Pitkin to Richard Rust; and later, Daniel Webster to Lord Derby. He speedily became a favorite in English society, and received much attention from Sir Walter Scott. the Lockharts, Mary Howitt, Lady Blessington, and others.

About 1829, he commenced, in Boston, the publication of an annual, entitled "The Token, or Atlantic Souvenir." To this, which continued for twelve or fourteen years, many authors then famous, or who have since become so, contributed. There is one episode connected with "The Token" which is worth telling in this connection: Among the papers submitted to Mr. Goodrich for admission to the columns of the annual were several anonymous ones, which seemed to him to indicate extraordinary powers in their author. A correspondence ensued between him and this writer, the latter's letters being signed N. Hawthorne. This was at first supposed to be a disguise, but Mr. Goodrich soon met and made arrangements with the writer, destined to be afterward so famous as Nathaniel Hawthorne. The articles called "Sights from a Steeple," "The Voices of the Dead," "Sketches Beneath an Umbrella," "The Prophetic Pictures," etc., etc., appeared successively in "The Token." Now and then an astute critic seemed to see through them, but they generally passed without notice.

In 1837, Mr. Goodrich recommended to Mr. Hawthorne to publish a volume comprising all that he had contributed to the annual. Mr. Hawthorne consented, but Mr. Goodrich had now ceased to be a publisher, and it was difficult to find anyone who would undertake the responsibility and incur the risk of loss. The agent of the American Stationers' Company consented to bring out the work if he could be insured against the results of failure. Mr. Goodrich then abandoned his copyright upon the tales, which were, of course, his property, as he had bought and paid for them, and Mr. Horatio Bridge, a classmate of Hawthorne's, afterward paymaster in the navy, agreed to indemnify the company against loss. The book, which Mr. Hawthorne intended to publish under the title of "Provincial Tales," appeared under that of "Twice-Told Tales," and though seemingly a failure for a year or so, began soon afterward to attract notice, and may be said to have been the author's first step on the ladder of fame.

It would be impossible to give here a list of Mr. Goodrich's various works. The earlier volumes of the "Parley Series" were the "Tales about America," "Parley's Tales about Europe," "Parley's Winter-Evening Tales," "Parley's Asia," "Parley's Sun, Moon, and Stars," and many others. In a little volume—we quote from a late biographyentitled "Peter Parley's Geography for Children," was a picture representing the author sitting in a chair, with his foot bound up and a crutch at his side, while he is saying to the boys about him, "Take care, don't touch my gouty toe. If you do, I won't tell you any more stories." Of this work more than two million copies were sold, and of course "Peter Parley" and his crutch were pretty generally associated in the minds of children.

To show what an impression this picture produced on the minds of young people, it will be well to give "Peter Parley's" own words: "On another occasion," he says, "I think at Savannah, a gentleman called on me, introducing two children, who were anxious to see 'Peter Parley.' The girl reached up to me and gave me a ringing kiss at once. We were immediately the best friends in the world. The boy, on the contrary, held himself aloof, and ran his eye over me, up and down, from top to toe. He then walked round me, surveying me with the most scrutinizing gaze. After this he sat down, and took no further notice of me. At parting, he gave me a keen look, but said not a word. The next day the gentleman called, and said that his grandson, on their way home, remarked to him, 'Grandfather, I would n't have anything to do with that man; he aint "Peter Parley".' 'How do you know that?' asked the grandfather. 'Because,' said the boy, 'he has n't got his foot bound up and he does n't walk with a crutch."

In his "Recollections of a Lifetime," Mr. Goodrich states that he had been the author or editor of one hundred and seventy volumes. The "Parley Books" were all wholly original, while many of the school-books were compilations in which he had the assistance of other hands. The "Tales" were translated into many languages, even into Persian and modern Greek. There is today a Japanese edition of the "Universal History," a book for young people, published in Tokio, and, singularly enough, not in Japanese but in English. Charles Sumner once said that at the bottom of a Cornish mine he saw two books; one was the Bible and the other "Peter Parley's Tales of the Sea." Several blind asylums in America publish editions in raised type of the school histories. At the time of Mr. Goodrich's death, some eight million copies of his books had been sold, and since that time probably a million more have been printed.

Mr. Goodrich was a good public speaker and debater. He delivered his lecture "Ireland and the Irish" forty times, which in those early days was deemed a goodly number. He represented his district in the Massachusetts legislature in 1836, and took a prominent part in the presidential campaign of 1840. He was a strong advocate of temperance, and a pamphlet by him on the "Fifteen-Gallon Jug" created a great deal of excitement. He was made U.-S. consul to Paris, in 1851, by President Fillmore, and his house was for some years a favorite resort of Americans. He was superseded in his office, in 1853, by President Pierce, in spite of a petition for his retention, signed by the best-known members of the American colony. The latter, upon his departure, presented him with a silver-gilt medallion likeness of himself, the work of Adam Salomon.

Mr. Goodrich suffered severely from the frauds of imitators, and some persons even took his name of "Peter Parley" and used it, defending themselves on the ground that it was not his, and that they had as much right to it as he. Some two hundred "Parley Books," more or less fraudulent, have been published in this country and in England. The principal offender in this respect was Thos. Tegg, as publisher, and as author, one George Mogridge. An edition of one of these works in sheets was even sent from London to New York, where it was intended to bind them and throw them upon the market. They were seized, however, at the custom-house, and the English pirates were compelled to pay a round sum to get their property back.

Poems by Mr. Goodrich may be found in the various collections of American verse. In one of these, Mr. Rufus

W. Griswold writes: "All of Mr. Goodrich's productions inculcate pure morality and cheerful views of life. His style is simple and unaffected; the flow of his verse is melodious; and his subjects generally are those which he is capable of treating most effectively."

Mr. Goodrich returned from Europe in 1855, and purchased a house in New York, where he lived for several vears, spending his summers in a quaint old red-brick mansion in Southbury, Conn. His last publication was a large "History of the Animal Kingdom," in two volumes, illustrated and dedicated, by permission, to Agassiz. He had hardly completed this work when he died, suddenly, after a few hours' illness, at his home in Ninth Street, May 9, 1860, at the age of sixty-seven. His remains were buried at Southbury on the following Sunday. It would be difficult to find in this country, among persons of advanced years or even in middle life, any one who had not in his youth read "Peter Parley." In Jamaica Plain, near Boston, is a country-house and grounds known to this generation as Parleyvale. This place, now shrunk to small dimensions, once extended over a hundred acres, and was made out of a forest by Mr. Goodrich, and by him was called Rockland.

He married first, in Jan., 1817, Adeline Gratia, daughter of Stephen Rowe Bradley, for sixteen years U.-S. senator from Vermont; she died in June, 1822; married second, in Jan., 1826, Mary Booth, daughter of a prominent merchant in Boston; she died in 1863.

Henry Harrison⁶ Goodrich (James⁵ Zebulon⁴ Zebulon³ -David² William¹), born in Tioga, Penn., Feb. 28, 1825; educated in the village school, and afterward assisted his father, who was postmaster of Tioga; he then clerked in a dry-goods store, which he left to study law; after a year's study, he got an appointment to the military academy at West Point, but poor health obliged him to return

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his commission and give up study for three years. In 1848, he went to Philadelphia, and was present at the nomination of Taylor for president. In 1850, he went to the Bermuda Islands, where he was introduced to Capt. Elliot, governor of the islands, and to the Earl of Dundonald, rear admiral of the British navy. In 1853, he was appointed postmaster at Tioga, but ill-health obliged him to resign, and he went West and lived a year at the Falls of St. Anthony, Minn., and was there in February, 1855, when the Fort-Snelling Reservation was opened for settlement. He located a claim, but by intimidation of the "land syndicate" of St. Paul, sold it, but was cheated out of it and a prospective fortune.

He was clerk of the first city board of election at St. Anthony's Falls, and carried the returns to the capitol. Subsequently for two years he resided at Prairie du Chien, Iowa, connected with the Galena and St. Paul steamers and with Burbank & Blakeley's N.-W. Ex. Co. In 1859, he became teller of the Tioga County Bank, where he remained until 1866, when he retired to his farm. In 1885, he received the appointment to a position in the U.-S. mint at Philadelphia, where he was in 1887. He has often received the nomination to various offices in his county, but his party being in the minority, he failed of election; he was representative delegate to the State convention of 1876, and senatorial delegate to that of 1880; was a member of the State Central Committee in 1876-77; was a member of the Centennial Admission Department in 1876, at Philadelphia. In 1882, he was one of eight persons chosen to write the history of Tioga County. He had in 1887 a volume of poems in preparation, including his own original poems and some translations from French poets.

Hiram P.6 Goodrich (Benjamin D.5 Benjamin4 Benjamin³ David² William¹), born Dec. 6, 1800; died in 1861; his parents died when he was young, and being without means to obtain an education, his uncle, Charles Goodrich of Pittsfield, Mass., sent him to college, where he graduated with high honors. He then studied for the ministry, and went to Lynchburgh, Vai, where he was pastor of a church and professor in a college for several years; he then went West to take a professorship in a new college at Palmyra, Mo., but finding the finances of the college inadequate, he went to Jefferson City, Mo., and preached with great success; he then went to St. Louis, and established a church at Carondelet, which became very prosperous. He was a man of great general knowledge and remarkable memory. He became greatly interested in the genealogy of the Goodrich family, and probably did more than any one else in collecting information about Goodriches, both in this country and in England. His collection, in 1861, was in possession of H. B. Goodrich of Chicago, who placed it in the hands of Edwin Hubbard, who was then engaged in tracing out some of the Goodrich families. Soon after this, H. B. Goodrich was murdered while on his way to St. Louis, and as Rev. H. P. Goodrich died about the same time, and his son was said to be in the Confederate army, there seemed to be no one to whom the manuscript could properly be returned. They were carefully boxed and placed in care of the Chicago Historical Society, and were burned in the great fire of 1871. His health having improved, in 1841, he sold out his business and joined the Rock River Conference, which then embraced Northern Illinois, all of Wisconsin and Iowa; he was made presiding elder of the Green-Bay district, with oversight of the

Oneida and Brothertown Indian missions, to which was added the Lake Superior missions. These missions and their schools involved the receipt and disbursement annually of large sums of money, which was done by him, to the entire satisfaction of those to whom he was responsible. In 1844, he was made presiding elder of Chicago district, but remained only one year, the baneful effects of the lake winds upon his weak lungs compelling him again to leave the active work of the ministry. He again engaged in business with his brother at Dubuque, where he resided, loved and honored by all who knew him, preaching as his health allowed, and laboring for the Master until his death. His wife died in 1858, and in 1861 he was married to Miss Emiline Minil of Rome, N.Y., who died in 1866. In 1869, he was again married to Mrs. Amanda Samuels of Dubuque, who survives him. He ranked high as an able and successful preacher; he was a polished gentleman, amiable in disposition, kind in mien, and won the respect and confidence of all he came in contact with; he was the charm of his home and the social circles in which he moved.



While pursuing his boyhood studies in the public school, he watched the methods of the manufacture of iron and studied them carefully in detail, and in

1848, at the age of nineteen years, he took charge of the Fulton furnaces Nos. 1 and 2, and so conspicuous was the executive ability here manifested, and so prompt was he in all business engagements, that in 1851 he had three very liberal propositions from outside parties to engage with them. Though barely passed his minority, it was insisted by his near relatives that he should go into business on his own account, and as an inducement for him to do so, his maternal uncle, Daniel Hillman, offered him a one-fourth interest in the Mt. Etna property, consisting of thirty thousand acres of land in Hickman County, Tenn., with the proviso that he should take the charge of it, "bear all losses, and share all gains."

Making a careful inspection of the property, he found ample supplies of material for the business; everything was promising, with but a single drawback, the great distance from market-forty miles by wagons; but this he believed could be overcome by the navigation of Duck River, for which a company was organized and an appropriation secured from the State. In anticipation of this, Mr. Goodrich pushed forward his work on the Etna Furnace; but when about ready to kindle its fires, the navigation company failed, with its work only partially complete, leaving Mr. Goodrich without his anticipated transportation; but still, nothing daunted, he built his fires and began work, the products of which proved of the very best quality, and abundant in quantity. But all hopes of success were blasted by being shut off from market. In 1853, when buyers were offering from sixty to seventy-five · dollars per ton for iron, Mr. Goodrich had over two thousand tons ready for the market, on which he could realize nothing. As a result, in December, 1854, the fires of the Etna were extinguished, and he was called to Centre Furnace, Kentucky, recently erected by his uncle, where he remained until 1861, when he returned and rebuilt the fires of the Etna Furnace, and began a most successful work. In December, 1863, using his own words, "a Federal

force swooped down on us like a mad eagle, and in less than three hours cleared the place of mules, wagons, and negroes, leaving the furnace to run by itself." This was the last blast of this furnace.

Mr. Goodrich was not a politician in a political sense of the word, he certainly was not a secessionist; it also may be claimed that his sympathies were not with the North: however that may be, it must be admitted that his motto was "the Union and the Constitution one and inseparable." He took no active part in the war of the Rebellion, quietly attending to business until his works were destroyed, when he engaged for a few years in the manufacture of woolen goods, doing an extensive business. Disposing of this interest, he turned his attention to the building of the Duck-River Valley Railroad. In this enterprise he was the leading spirit, and the work was rapidly pushed forward under his superintendence from Columbia. While engaged in this enterprise, in 1873, he was appointed superintendent of the Oxmoore Furnace, in Alabama. It was here his skill as a manufacturer of iron rose to its zenith. So marked was his success, that the president of the furnace company, in his annual report, said: "By comparing results with those of former years, the product has been doubled, the cost reduced one-half, and the iron produced improved in quality as much as in quantity."

In 1876–8, Mr. Goodrich was induced to lend his influence to an undertaking for building the Nashville and Tuscaloosa Railroad. He became the animating spirit of the enterprise. In 1880, the Warner Furnace, in Hickman County, Tennessee, was built under his superintendence; its fires were kindled on Nov. 25, and in the following April, 1881, this furnace had produced twenty-two hundred and sixty tons of the best quality of pig-iron. He accomplished during that year what had never before been done in the State: the furnace, built for a twenty-ton furnace, was by him made to yield forty-five tons daily, a success as yet unequalled. It is not saying to much of him to

say that as an exponent of this industry no one ranked higher. In his decision of all questions of doubt he was seldom at fault; but he was in advance of the times. Birmingham, Ala., is today what Mr. Goodrich predicted years since it would be, and what even then it might have been if its mines of iron-ore had only been developed. He was also interested in and one of the directors of the Arrow Steamship Company, which is now building its first vessel—the *Pocahontas*—at their ship-yard, Alexandria, Va.

While he was ambitious to become a skilled manufacturer, he had also an ambition that was more exalted still, and that was to live a devoted Christian life. He made all business interests bend to this. It is said of him that he would discharge a man from his employ for uttering an oath as soon as for not performing his work. He was always ready with a word of encouragement and sympathy for the needy and distressed. In all his enterprises his sole reliance was upon "if God will." His kindness of heart, his urbanity, his deference and respect for the opinions of others were marked characteristics of his life. He took an active interest in collecting materials for a genealogy of the Goodrich family, and was at the time of his death a member of the executive committee of the Goodrich Family Association. Aaron⁷ Goodrich (Levi H.⁶ Aaron⁵ Aaron⁴ Josiah³ David² William¹), born in the township of Sempronius, Cayuga County, N.Y., July 6, 1807; died June 24, 1887; married, Aug. 10, 1870, Alice Paris, born in Bogota, New Granada, Feb. 11, 1849. Most of the years of his minority were spent on his father's farm; his education was in part obtained in the common district-school and partly under the tutelage of his parents, both of whom were thorough practical educators of that day; not far from his twentieth year he went into the employment of Isaac W. Skinner of Buffalo, as traveling agent for his extensive iron foundry, where he soon proved himself worthy of a wider field of labor, and in a short time became the junior member of the firm of Skinner & Goodrich. It was while in this position that Judge Wilkinson, recognizing the ability of the firm and fearing its rivalry in business, succeeded, by offering extraordinary inducements, in allying him to his own vast interests. Here he not only distinguished himself in business life, but also in public life-chosen alderman while Judge Wilkinson served as mayor; it was while so engaged that he began the study of law. He eventually severed his connection with this firm and went to Tennessee, finished his course of law, and was admitted to its practice in Dover, Stewart County. He rose rapidly in his profession, and soon took rank among the most prominent of the profession in his adopted State. One prominent characteristic that distinguished him was his originality; he was original in everything; in this he was a tower of strength. He was always active as a politician.

In 1847–8, he was elected to the legislature of the State, the only Whig who ever represented his district in the halls of legislation. At this time he was nominated presidential elector on the Whig ticket, in opposition to the Hon. Isham G. Harris, ex-governor of the State; was elected; cast his vote for Taylor and Fillmore, for whom he stumped the State. Upon the territorial organization of Minnesota, he was appointed its chief-justice, where for three years he demonstrated great ability as a jurist and constitutional lawyer. On retiring from the bench, he resumed the practise of his profession in St. Paul. where he was regarded as preëminently the foremost jurist of the time. In the organization of Minnesota as a State, he took an active part; when admitted into the Union, in 1858, he, with a majority of the legislature opposed to him in politics, was appointed a member of the commission to revise the laws and prepare a system of pleadings and practice for the State courts; two years later he was made chairman of the commission which prepared a system of pleadings and practice. Judge Goodrich has always opposed what is known as the "code" system of practice, and gave his views on this subject in the introduction to a minority report before the legislature in 1858. The legal student will find it worthy of consultation.

In politics the Judge was a Whig, but, on the demise of that party, cast his lot with the Republican party; was a delegate to the convention that nominated Abraham Lincoln, but cast his vote for William H. Seward. It is said of him that on September 17, the same year, he appeared on the balcony of the International Hotel at St. Paul, and in one of the best speeches ever made by that gentleman introduced to a vast concourse of people the Hon. William H. Seward; a speech that has become historic, and, says the St. Paul *Daily Times*, "we hazard nothing in pronouncing it one of the finest specimens to be found in our annals."

In March, 1861, he was appointed by President Lincoln secretary of legation at Brussels, and served in that capacity eight years. During this period he found time to gratify his literary and more particularly his antiquarian tastes, visiting various parts of the Eastern continent, none of which he enjoyed more than his visit to Goodrich Castle, from which he brought away with him the views that now adorn this memorial volume. It was during these years while abroad that he gathered the material for a literary work, which produced a very decided sensation when published, in 1874, by D. Appleton & Co., New York, entitled "A History of the Character and Achievements of the so-called Christopher Columbus."

On his return from Europe, he was again drawn into the vortex of politics. In 1872, sent delegate to the Liberal Republican Convention at Cincinnati, where he cast his vote for David Davis, U.-S. senator from Illinois. During his last ten years he led a retired life, enjoying himself in the seclusion of his home, where he had one of the finest libraries in the country and a rare collection of old and obsolete works collected in Eastern countries. He achieved fame as a scholar, statesman, orator, jurist, and author. Eminently companionable, but never hesitated to express his opinions openly and frankly. Few are the men held in such high estimation as he was in his own city with all classes of men, and few, if any, will be more missed.

In the month of April, 1849, two men, strangers, met at the white house in Washington, D.C., and were admitted together to President Taylor's reception-room; perceiving that the men were unacquainted, the president said: "Allow me, Mr. Goodrich, to introduce you to Peter Parley; Peter Parley, Mr. Goodrich." "An acquaintance was then made that became a bond of friendship most highly prized, and was sundered only by death."

His education was that of the common school, limited to a few months during the year, but these were more than duplicated at home under the tutelage of his parents, both of whom were educators. In 1836, he went with his parents to Michigan, where they settled on a farm, near the present village of Goodrich. Here he began his life's work, and to him can the words of the psalmist be literally applied: "A man was famous according as he had lifted up axes

upon the thick trees." Hundreds of acres of timber have gone down before him and been converted into lumber. While in the full tide of prosperity, fire swept away his mills, and with them thousands of hard-earned capital. He rebuilt his mills and continued his business as before, until he passed it into other hands and settled upon his farm. He had been a resident of the State but ten years when he was nominated to represent his district in the State legislature, and elected, when his own county was overwhelmingly opposed to him in politics.

The great question of the session was the removal of the State capital to Lansing. He championed the removal, became a leader in the effort, and was successful. So faithful was he in his devotion to the best interests of the State in his legislative capacity, that his name was put in nomination for the State senate, and was almost unanimously elected by the combined votes of the Whigs and Democrats. He was given the chairmanship on the committee on incorporations, one of the most important committees; the record of which attests the ability and faithfulness of the work done. After the close of his public labors at this time, he returned to his farm, as he says, to spend his days in the quiet of his home; residence, Fostoria, Mich.

life on the farm, which pursuit he cheerfully engaged in, but not with a satisfied mind. Very early his physical and mental powers were made to diverge by force of circumstances; manual labor was made the pursuit of one, while the other asserted its right in search after knowledge. These two divided purposes of life produced such an effect upon his physical system that before the age of twelve years his general health became so impaired that it was found necessary to remove him from all manual labor, and allow him the desired indulgence of his books. At the age of fifteen years he entered Middlebury Academy. where he continued his studies for the two following years, when declining health compelled his retirement for rest and recuperation; positive rest from all mental labor was the injunction, which was strictly obeyed, with the best of results. With improved health he returned to his studies; but he soon passed its curriculum, and was left to himself for further progress. His forte, as a student, was mathematics. He had already traversed Hutton's full course, mastered each subject in detail, and now, when casting about for the future before him, he was advised to take up the study of history. Here his disciplined mind revelled. It was nothing uncommon for him to go over forty pages of closely-printed matter at a single recitation, giving incident and fact in his own language in detail. From the academy he returned home with improved health.

When in the nineteenth year of his age he entered the law-office of Hon. John T. Bush of Buffalo. How long he remained in this office is not certainly known, but this much is known of him, that the study of the law was not altogether congenial to his taste. It was not the aliment to satisfy his mathematical mind. He accordingly engaged with the Port Huron and Lake Michigan Railroad Company as civil engineer, for the survey of their route across the country, as a means for gratifying his mathematical taste; but the miasma of the swamps and marshes of St. Clair County soon compelled his retirement with a disease that well-nigh cost him his life.

Regaining his health, he again entered upon the study of law in the office of Hon, Alfred H. Hanscom of Pontiac. This relationship culminated in the law firm of Hanscom & Goodrich. As a pleader at the bar, Hanscom was unsurpassed in the State, while, on the other hand, Goodrich rose rapidly as a counsellor, and developed a remarkable ability in preparing "briefs" for cases in court. This combination of strength and ability soon made this law firm one of the first in the State. Eventually, however, the sustaining influence of the firm fell upon Mr. Goodrich, as the star of Hanscom's popularity began to wane just as it had reached its zenith. As a consequence, Mr. Goodrich became the leading man of the firm, both as counsellor and pleader before the courts. One most remarkable characteristic of the man was his memory; this was evidenced through his whole life, but the culmination of its strength was only realized in his arguments before the courts in his citation of authorities, giving the book, case, and page of his authority, and, if pertinent to his case, would give page after page of his cited authority without an error. In this respect he was the equal of Hon. Edward Everett, whose record as yet is unsurpassed. Death came suddenly at the age of thirty-six years.

At a meeting of the Detroit bar, a glowing tribute to his character and attainments was pronounced by Chief-Justice Whipple, and resolutions passed expressive of their profound esteem and admiration in which he was held by his professional brethren.

Harry C.7 Goodrich (Levi⁶ Nathan⁵ Nathan⁴ Benjamin³ David² William¹), born Mar. 22, 1832; went with his parents when five years of age from Potsdam, St. Lawrence Co., N.Y., to St. Charles, Kane Co., Ill., where in less than three years he, with a younger brother, were left orphans. His educational advantages, even for that early day, were limited, but by perseverance he early succeeded in laying a good foundation for the acquirements of his maturer years. From a boy he manifested a fondness for mechanics to such an extent as to indicate the whole bent of his mind for a life-work. The one study uppermose in his mind was to invent, and it was this close application to that one pursuit that distinguished him in later years. At the age of eighteen years he engaged in the manufacture of shingles, that took the first premium at the Mechanics' Institute in 1853. Afterward he went into the employ of the American Car Works; all the while bringing into practical use the test of a close study of mechanics as applied to labor, the ultimatum of which has been his celebrated "tuck-marker," as sewing-machine attachment, brought out in 1865, and soon gained for him a world-wide reputation. This, with other sewing-machine attachments of his invention and patent, have gone with the sewing-machine into every part of the world with a still growing popularity.

It was not until 1867 that he really began the manufacture of his patents, and then without adequate capital. Yet his sales for the year were \$3000, for the second they were \$15,000, the third \$30,000, the fourth \$75,000, and the fifth \$125,000, and now the closing of the year 1886 foots up a large amount, after the general reduction in the price of all kinds of manufacture, for which his celebrated tuck-marker must to a great extent be given the credit. While this has claimed his chief attention, care, and oversight, still other enterprises have claimed their share at the same time. He was one of the projectors of the Chicago, Pekin and Southwestern Railway; also the controlling corporator of the Chicago Screw Company, which has become a thriving industry. He is one of nature's own men, selfmade; began life alone, unaided; has pushed on thus far along life's way by his own persistent efforts; having lived sufficiently long, though now only in middle life, to reap the gratifying fruits of his labors. In no sense a politician, but a staunch Republican; never sought or accepted a civil office, and desires none; eminently social in his nature, as well as genial, readily makes friends and retains them. David Goodridge was out looking for a stray cow they surrounded him and demanded his surrender." He spurred his horse and escaped to the garrison. An alarm was fired, men came in from the neighboring settlement, and the Indians retired and concealed themselves. In his flight he lost his hat, and ten years after, an Indian prisoner, taken somewhere on the Connecticut River, had on his head the identical hat.

"Fitchburg was set off from Lunenburg, Feb. 3, 1764, and David Goodridge was one of the first board of selectmen chosen. He was sent as delegate of the town to the provincial congress which met at Concord and Cambridge in 1774—John Hancock, president—and was sent again the next year to the congress which met at Cambridge, Feb. 1, 1775.

"David Goodridge moved from Ipswich to Lunenburg. In 1741, Elizabeth Martin, wife of David Goodridge, was dismissed from the Chebacco Church in Ipswich to the church in Lunenburg. "In 1640, John Martin was admitted freeman in Charlestown. Another John Martin was admitted freeman in 1665. In 1823, he, in company with Musgrove Evans, Gen. Joseph Brown, and others, left Sackett's Harbor on a schooner and went to Michigan, where Mr. Goodrich took up a large tract of government land on Raisin River, three miles from the present village of Tecumseh. The year following he took his family there, embarking at Sackett's Harbor on a schooner. They were ten days crossing the lake. Crossing the country to Buffalo with their teams, they again took a schooner, which proved unseaworthy, and a great storm came near wrecking them. After eleven days' sailing they landed at Monroe, where the family rested while Mr. Goodrich walked thirty miles on an Indian trail to Tecumseh, to find a house for his family to winter in. He missed his way, and night found him in an oak opening, three miles from his destination. Seeking shelter under the thick boughs of an oak, he decided to remain for the night; but a terrible thunder shower came up, and he left the tree for an open space. Shortly after the tree was struck by lightning, and he was thrown to the ground by the shock. He lay unconscious for a long time, and morning found him in the house of his friend Musgrove Evans.

* Nothing is known to the compiler of the ancestry of Thomas S. Goodrich. His descendants, after long searching, being unable to find anything relating to his ancestors. He is said to have had brothers Caleb (4108) and Zenas (4109), a sister Ruth (4110), who married — Carey and lived in Jefferson County, N.Y. One of his brothers is said to have been a major in the War of 1812. He found an abandoned log-house for his family, but they were in their new home but six weeks when his son George died, leaving a wife and infant daughter. This was the first death in the township.

Snakes, wolves, and Indians were very numerous and troublesome. The nearest grist-mill was at Monroe, thirty miles distant, and they often had to pound corn in a mortar for samp or grind it in a coffee-mill. Mrs. Goodrich washed the seeds from pomice brought from the cider-mill at Monroe and planted them, thus starting the orchards of that vicinity. Mr. Goodrich built the first saw-mill, the first frame house and barn and the first frame school-house in the county. He was a justice-of-the-peace, and married the first couple in Tecumseh. He and his youngest son also helped to build the first grist-mill there. One day when he was absent an Indian came to his house, and seizing his daughter Deborah, dragged her out and tried to make her drink some whisky. Her mother followed, and the Indian asked her to drink also. Pretending to do so, the Indian released the daughter and they both escaped to the house and barricaded the door, while the younger children sought safety in the garret. The Indian tried to break down the door, but failing, began to split it with an ax, and the mother and daughter retreated to the garret, pulled the ladder up after them, and guarded the opening with clubs. Finding himself defeated, the Indian started for the house of Ira Goodrich, who with his wife and children were all sick. Deborah ran three miles to the mill where her father was at work, and gave the alarm, and he and others ran to the rescue.

Mr. Goodrich filled many town offices, was greatly interested in the schools, and was an active and influential man in many ways. In politics an inflexible Whig; in religion a strong Baptist. He married, about 1795, Catharine Ramsey, born in Amsterdam, N.Y., March 31, 1777; died April 25, 1836. After her death he married a second time, and his wife survived him.

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
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
